They made plans for competition in basketball and other sports, sandwiched around social activities.

The Sierra Nevada Classic was born. "It was simply about friends getting together to swap stories about the past and to get caught up with what was going on in our lives," said classic founder Mike Borda.

But it was also about getting competitive juices flowing again.

Other former athletes who knew some of the participants heard about the event, and wanted to get involved. Soon, there were 18 who were signed up, and it grew from there.

Last weekend, 30 ex-jocks - two-thirds of them Carson High School graduates gathered in the capital city for the 11th annual classic.

**Competing in three events** 

They were divided into 10 three-man teams for competition in basketball and Wiffle ball at Carson High and bowling at Carson Lanes. Points were awarded to teams placing first through fourth in each of the events to determine the overall

The Triple Play team — comprised of Mike Berkich, Rob Stoddard and Michael Johnson — took top overall honors. The team finished third the previous two years.

The Colt .45s, champions in 2004, placed second this year. Team members are Jim McHugh, Jim Tierney and

As team captains and officials gathered before the classic in the old Nevada Supreme Court chambers, Gov. Kenny Guinn drew the first tournament seed.

Other team captains said the event is about renewing friendships. But they also said the nature of former athletes is to compete hard for bragging rights. As a result, they said injuries aren't uncommon.

The entire experience is like a combination of Animal House and the Iditarod," said veteran competitor Kip Perry, a 1990 Carson High graduate who has been part of the classic since its inception.

Competitors range from 25 to 45 years old. Several live in the Reno area.

There's even a former National Football League player involved. Johnson, who grew up in Solano, Calif., and teaches in Sacramento, was a wide receiver for the Chicago Bears and Atlanta Falcons. And Powell, who's from the Los Angeles area, played college basketball at Dominican College in San Rafael, Calif., and for two years professionally in Australia.

A number of others in the classic were on collegiate sports teams.

Several members of the Borda family are actively involved in the classic, including longtime Carson City resident John Borda, a former athlete at Douglas High School and ex-coach in

John Borda, along with Rick Oxoby of Carson City, officiated during the competition. And the group even had a cameraman, Dustan Page, to record what happened.

Other activities included a golf tournament and social events throughout the area.


