Gentlemen,

The Sierra Nevada Athletic Commission welcomes you to the 13th Annual Sierra Nevada Classic. As some of the greatest athletes from around the globe (as in The Old Globe Saloon) descend on Carson City and Carson Valley, a palatable frenzy has taken hold of the area with a force that would rival only one other event in this great state's history—The Carson City Chili Cook-Off and Whistle-Off of 1983. As some of the gentlemen from out of the state might not have experienced this happening, the SNC Commission can only liken this excitement with such epic events as the 1984 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles, the 1989 San Francisco 49ers, and more recently, the unseeded Fresno State Bulldogs' upset win in the 2008 College World Series.

On September 19th, the SNC XIII will get underway as we all get together for good food, good drinks and good competition. This year's trophy is up for grabs as any team can win this coveted event on any given Saturday. As this is the last year in which basketball will be an event, some teams will be pushing harder than ever to win while other teams are counting the days until this event is gone. One thing is certain—only one team will be able to claim the last title in an era that will soon be known as "The Early Days".

Established in May of 1996, the Sierra Nevada Classic has traveled a long road and has evolved not only into a gathering of great athletes, but of greater importance—great friends. As another year together begins and the bonds among this group strengthen, keep in mind how fortunate we all are to have a band of brothers known as The Sierra Nevada Classic.

Below is a list of official changes that have been implemented by the Commission for the 13th Annual Tournament.

Changes are as follows:

- 1) Twelve-year Veteran Roger "The Hammer" Borda officially retires from the only team he ever knew, The Point Shavers. The Hammer will become the second member to be inducted into the SNC Hall of Fame.
- 2) Rick "The Count" Oxoby takes a one-year sabbatical from the tournament in which he officiated for six years and participated in as an athlete for one year. The Commission has yet to decide if The Count will return to his officiating duties in 2009. Negotiations between Oxoby's lawyer and the Commission are currently ongoing.
- 3) Mike "The Silent Assassin" Borda returns to the Point Shaver's Roster after a one-year stint on the injured reserve.
- 4) Bruce "The Sheriff" Barnes is signed to a one year contract by the Commission to take over officiating duties with the absence of Oxoby.
- 5) Rookie venom Kevin "Special K" Verre is signed by the veteran squad the Point Shavers. This marks the first roster change for the Points Shavers since the league's beginning in 1996.
- 6) Four Sierra Nevada Classic Members will receive The Decade of Service Award. Paul "Packsand" Kinne, Carlos "The Apostle" Mendeguia, Ron "Silk" Powell and Mike "Goose" Wetenkamp.
- 7) All SNC Members will attend the formal seeding in the Historic Assembly Chamber in the Nevada State Capital building. Two surprise Nevada Hall of Fame Members will be participate in the seeding events. The Sierra Nevada Athletic Commission will also unveil the new official logo adopted by the Sierra Nevada Classic while in the Assembly Chamber.

John "Brute" Borda (2007 Hall Of Fame Inductee)

Now in his second year in the SNC Hall Of Fame, the Brute is said to still be calling some shots behind the scenes. Borda refereed for eleven SNC Tournaments and was also the sole referee for the first six tournaments. He was one of the key components in getting the league underway and one of his biggest accomplishments was convincing previous Governor Kenny Guinn to attend the SNC 11 Tournament Seeding at the Capital Building. It was probably better that the Commission never inquired as to what favors the

previous Governor of the State of Nevada owed the Brute for fear of opening a can of worms that was better left sealed.



Roger "The Hammer" Borda (1st Ballot HOF)

Roger Borda was a shoe in for the SNC Hall of Fame the moment he announced his retirement this off-season. He will be forever known as "The Hammer" to veteran members throughout the Classic. His storied 12 year career included five SNC Championships. Although the SNC MVP award avoided his trophy case throughout his tenure, he was said to be the perfect fit for the Point Shavers success in those early years. The Hammer will also be

remembered for the stunning tan lines he showcased every tournament. And who can forget the Hammer's infamous slide approaching the bowling line at the alley. He still holds the title in the SNC for most drinks consumed before 11:00am on tourney day. Unlike the cry baby antics of Brett Favre this off-season, the Hammer went out strong during his final press conference and looks forward to retirement on his ranch in Northeast Nevada. Even with the absence of Hammer at SNC 13, most members will still be looking over their shoulders for that sucker punch in the kidney that was always part of The Hammer's arsenal.

Ted "The Sheep Whisperer" Borda (1-Year Veteran Official)

Ted Borda returns after one of the best rookie seasons in league history. His ability to step right in and not back down from veteran athletes was a major plus in gaining respect throughout the league. In wiffleball, Borda raced down the line like a gazelle crossing the Serengeti Desert and his "streeeeriiikkkeee" call behind the dish reminds you of a Basque yodel without the playfulness. The only thing Borda needs to work on for the nearing Classic is the color of his legs. This shade of white hasn't been seen on a pair of gams in the Classic's

history, which is quite a feat considering the fact that his cousin Roger usually sports the milky, "the last time my legs saw sun was last year's SNC" look.



Bruce "The Sheriff" Barnes (Rookie Official)

Bruce Barnes steps in for the absent Oxoby and will be far from a rookie on tournament day. Even twelve year veteran members of the classic no better than to question any calls made by this Carson City Icon. To cross this official may mean the end of your tournament day, especially with the off-season purchase of Anheuser-Busch by a foreign company. With

the amount of Budweiser he has consumed and his close ties with the brand name, this official may be a bit on edge come tourney time. Look for "The Sheriff" to step right in and make decisive calls from the open tip in the gym. 2007 Sierra Nevada Classic – Champions!!! (4th Place Wiffleball, 1st Place Bowling)

2007 Summary

The partying hasn't stopped for Full House since September 15th of last year, as they became first team in Classic History to go from worst to first. Things were status quo for these perennial underachievers as they began the day with a one and done in the pretournament basketball game against the 2006 champion Triple Play. But unlike years past, Full House didn't cash in their chips and pulled out a grueling victory in wiffleball against the Penetrators 1-0. Moving on to the semifinals, they gave wiffleball powerhouse Fistfull of \$\$\$ all they could handle before narrowly losing 0-2. With another tough match up in the consolation game against the Colt .45s, they again came up short with a 1-4 loss and looked forward to the afternoon. And what an afternoon it was. Kris "Skeets" Kelly - Captain

Ten years was the lucky number for the SNC Veteran. Maybe, deep in the back of his mind, he never thought the trophy could be his. Throughout the years, this captain, despite the odds, gave his team every ounce of effort his 5'9" 150 lb frame could muster. His 172 bowling game in the championship match was the main reason his squad earned a chance for the bowl-off. Look for this now one-time champion to turn it up yet another notch and try to give his squad a chance to become only the second team in tournament history to repeat. He will do nothing to change his grueling off-season workouts in that 110 degree Texas heat. His conditioning is far and above the best every year in the Classic. But who knows if this conditioning is for the Classic or if it is for those 21 year old UT

Rich "All World" Hutson (MVP - 2007, MI - 2005)

What a difference a year makes for the current MVP and World Champion of the Sierra Nevada Classic. In SNC 11, this veteran's tourney officially ended on player introduction night. But SNC 12 would be a year to remember for "All World". Although his day started a bit rough in basketball with an opening round loss and a stat sheet of two points and one rebound, he moved onto wiffleball with a positive attitude. In an extra inning nail biter against the Penetrators, Hutson pitched all five innings of an extra inning game giving up only 1 hit while striking out four to get the win. Even in the Semifinal round, Hutson gave it all he had keeping the powerhouse Fistfull of \$\$\$ scoreless for two innings before eventually giving up a two run walk-off homer to Casanova in the bottom of the 3rd. And with his arm hanging by a thread, he was at the losing end of a 1-4 game against the Colt .45s. Hutson

also bowled the best of his tournament career capping the day with a 169 game in the bowl off to secure the SNC 12 Championship. However, despite all of the great things that All World did last year, he will most likely be remembered for his part in the Isaman/Hutson tandem break dance/pop show that took place at the J.T.



Tim "The Flame" Foster

For whatever reason, most SNC rookies returning to the tourney after the eye opening first year suffer from the sophomore jinx. But The Flame like his teammate Hutson, kept SNC 11 a thing of the past and was the dominant force at the Carson Lanes securing his squad a First Place finish that gave them the much needed 4 points to tie the leader Fistfull of \$\$\$. It was in the Bowl Off that The Flame made SNC History with a 224 game giving Full House their first title since their inception into the league. In wiffleball, Foster gave Full House a huge boost scoring the lone run in the first round game against the Penetrators. He also scored the only run in the Consolation game while collecting two hits. The only dark spot on Championship Day for Full House was the apparent lack of Picon consumption by the Flame. This accusation has been vehemently denied by the Flame who has gone as far as

agreeing to lie detector tests. In lieu of such actions, the SNC Commissioners' office has decided to have veterans Goose and 2-4-2 sit on each side of the Flame at the JT to validate the five picon requirement.

2008 Prediction – 2nd Place

Look for Full House to make a strong run at another title. With their bowling game easily one of the best in the tournament, all they need is one or two points in the morning events to be in the hunt for the repeat.

FISTFULL OF \$\$\$

2007 Sierra Nevada Classic – 2nd Place (1st Place Wiffleball, 4th Place Bowling)

2007 Summary

This was yet another solid year for the powerhouse squad, Fistfull of \$\$\$. However, for the fifth time in Classic history, Fistfull finished in second place, earning them the new team name, Fistfull of Buffalo Bills. Their tournament started out rough on Saturday morning with a first round hoops match up against Brickyard where they could only muster three baskets and bowed out of the gym with zero points. They took the loss like a veteran squad and strutted onto the wiffleball diamond. Although they breezed through the first round against the SNC 12 Champion Triple Play winning 14-2, they needed all of their efforts to win the next two games. It was a squeaker against Full House until a home run in the bottom of the third advanced them to the final game and in the championship game, they escaped Let it Ride, with a hard fought 2-1 victory. After lunch, unlike previous years, Fistfull came out strong in the opening two rounds at the Carson Lanes. However, in the semifinals they ran into Full House and lost a hard fought battle by 57 pins. Still, with the four points they already had going into bowling, all they needed to do was beat the Penetrators in the consolation game and the championship trophy was theirs. Not used to bowling so many games, Fistfull's stamina began to fade and they eventually lost by 90 pins, leading to only the second ever Bowl-Off in SNC history. In the title match for all the marbles, Fistfull couldn't pull it off and eventually lost by 75 pins to the newly crowned champions, Full House.

The Team



Billy "Dot" Borda - Captain (MVP - 2003)

Thirteen year SNC Captain, Bill Borda, again laces them up for another shot at the title. After a couple off years at the gym, (only one point scored last season), Borda will buckle down to leave the hardwood with a placing. Wiffleball proved to be a bit better for Fistfull's captain as he notched four hits en route to a first place finish. One of Dot's hits was for a home run which caused immediate steroid suspicion and follow up actions from the Commission. Unfortunately, there was no place for Dot to sit down to give a urine sample, so the Commission had to draw a vial of blood. After careful examination, the sample tested negative for steroids, but positive for estrogen. The Classic is currently ruling on whether estrogen is a banned substance. At lunch, he gave his squad a half time pep talk at the JT

and headed to the Carson Lanes eager for the challenge of getting the trophy back to Fistfull headquarters. For the first three games, Borda looked like a PBA Member going 135, 154 and 197. However, when it really counted in the Consolation game, Dot could only muster a feeble 106. He bounced back in the bowl off with a 145, but it was a too little too late.



David "The Stormin' Ex-Mormon" Dodson

David Dodson comes into this year's tourney with an impressive ten years under his belt. This one time polygamist and Church of Zion leader again will be the key piece in the power triangle known as Fistfull of \$\$\$. Along with his captain, Dodson could only scratch out one point in his team's opening round loss in hoops and was happy to move outside to the diamond where he does nothing but dominate every damn year. He didn't disappoint and in the three games had 6 hits--two of them monster home runs, adding to his league leading home run record. Interestingly, after each home run, Dodson could be overheard muttering great praises and thanks to Joseph Smith and Donnie and Marie Osmond. After half time, The Ex-Mormon braced himself for the event that has haunted him in several

tourneys past. But this year was different as he turned the corner and came through with an impressive overall performance for his team. Over the five games bowled, Dodson had a career best 135 average and gave it all he had with a 154 score in the final bowl-off.



Joe "Casanova" Tierney (MVP – 2005, ROY – 2000)

Joe Tierney strolls into SNC 13 leaving a scented trail of expensive European cologne. Back for his ninth time in the tourney, Casanova again will be the number one draw for autograph seekers. As the day opened on the hardwood, just like the rest of Fistfull, he could only score one point in their early morning loss. Wiffleball, however, was a different story. In three games he struck out ten batters while giving up only a total of three runs. He was equally impressive on offense getting eight hits, seven of which were for home runs setting a single day tourney record that may never be broken. But it was his semifinal round blast that was unforgettable. With his team tied in the bottom of the 3rd against Full House, he stepped up and blasted a walk off two-run homer to send them to the finals where they took another championship. After lunch and a quick stop in front of the mirror, Casanova was locked-in on the lanes.

He, like his teammate Dodson, bowled one of the best tournaments of his career with a 144 per game average, but it wasn't enough as Full House took the trophy and Rich Hutson took what surely would have been Casanova's MVP award.

2008 Prediction - 1st Place

Don't expect this team to again get a goose egg in hoops. With easily the best athletes in the league, this team is basically guaranteed four points in wiffleball and at least one or two in basketball. They are a tough squad to beat, especially with their bowling game coming on stronger each year.

2007 Sierra Nevada Classic – 3rd Place (1st Place Basketball)

2007 Summary

For the fourth time in tournament history, From The Brickyard finished in third place. Just like years past, they received their standard four points in basketball and then pretty much called it a day. They cruised through the gym without getting a game from any team during SNC12. In the championship match up against a tough Stage Fright team, they breezed to a 7-2 victory. This potent offensive machine was no match for any squad. They were on cloud nine as they skipped to the wiffleball field with the hope of matching their SNC 11 finish of at least a fourth place. But in the first round against Let it Ride, they were blown out 10-1 and came crashing back down to earth. With four points heading to the Carson Lanes, FTB just had to get one point to make a push for the title. They barely survived the pre-tourney bracket and entered the first round as the eighth seed where they battled to the last frame, but eventually lost to the Penetrators by 33 pins to end the day on a familiar note.

Ron "Silk" Powell – Captain (ROY – 1999)

Out of the magical Inverness forest, Ron Powell will arrive into town for his tenth Sierra Nevada Classic. During the past nine years this athlete has dominated in the gym on tourney day. Since, after 12 years in the Classic, this officially marks the last year of basketball as an event in the tourney, Silk plans to go out in style. He again was Brickyards scoring threat, making 10 of his teams 21 points during SNC 12. Look for nothing different at this year's tourney, especially with this being the swan song. Powell's wiffleball day was pretty uneventful going 0-2 with a strike out in Brickyards only game. The Carson Lanes would provide no solace for this veteran athlete who finished the day with a two game average of 127. Never in question, Powell's half time/drinking game will be in full swing as

the dreaded half time stop at the JT. As all veteran members know, a rookie's performance after the picons have been consumed is the true judge of their first season.


2008 Prediction - 10th Place


