SCRAMBLE RULES

Method of play and rules:

1. Play begins with each member of the group teeing off.
2. With the agreement of the other members of the group, the team captain decides which drive is the most desirable.
3. The other members of the group pick up their balls and proceed to the spot of the selected drive, where they will hit their second (or third, or fourth, etc. shot).
4. After the shot, all balls may be placed within one club length of the original ball. This may be done either to the side or backwards. Balls may not be placed closer to the hole.
5. In placing the ball, you may not change the condition of the shot. If the ball is in a hazard (e.g. sand trap, rough) all members of the team must play their shot from the trap or rough, respectively.
6. This procedure continues until the ball is in the hole.
7. On the putting green, **do not hole out a short putt if you have missed your first putt.** The first ball putted must count. Mark your ball and wait. If the second or third putt is better mark that putt. Under no circumstances will there be any gimmies.
8. At the end of each hole, the score for the group is recorded on the card.
9. All scorecards must be kept accurately and per hole.
10. Each player on the team must contribute at least **two** tee shots per 18 holes. When recording your score on the card, you must input which player's tee shot was used on every hole. Also mark down which member of your team made the putt.
11. The maximum score allowed is a double-par. After that, simply pick up the balls and move on to the next hole.



SNC HORSESHOE TOURNAMENT RULES

Method of play and rules:

1. All court layout dimensions, playing equipment and scoring will follow the official rules sanctioned by the NHPA (National Horseshoe Pitchers Association of America).
2. Cancellation scoring will be used to keep score during the tournament.
3. Ringer: Ringers cancel each other. A ringer of one contestant shall cancel a ringer of another contestant and those shoes shall not score any points. Any uncanceled (live) ringers shall score 3 points.
4. Shoes in Count: A shoe in count (upright horseshoe length from the stake) shall score one point under the following conditions: If there are cancelled ringers and no live ringer, the closest shoe in count to the stake shall score one point. If there are no ringers, the closest shoe in count to the stake shall score one point. If the other shoe of the same contestant is the second closest shoe in count, it shall also score one point. If there is one uncanceled ringer and the other shoe of the scoring contestant is the closest shoe in count to the stake, it shall score one point (four points total).
5. On tournament day, there will be one scorekeeper per game. This score sheet shall be the official record of the game. Contestants are encouraged to pay close attention to the score at all times. If a question or discrepancy occurs regarding the score, the contestant(s) may approach the scorekeeper between innings to rectify the situation. This scorekeeper or other identified authority will also judge any discrepancy of which contestants shoes are closer to the stakes during the game. If discrepancies cannot be corrected to the satisfaction of all contestants, the tournament judge shall be called in to make the final decision.
6. Each team will be comprised of four pitchers. Each team will be selected into an eight team bracket that will be drawn on seeding night.
7. The Horseshoe Tournament will begin with your team dividing into two teams of two contestants. **(These teams must be determined before seeding)**. Your two teams will be matched against the other team in your bracket who will also divide their team into two teams of two contestants.
8. Please note, that your "A" squad will match up with your opponents "A" squad along with "B" squad vs. "B" squad in your individual bracket. If both of your split squads win, you advance out of bracket. If one squad loses and the other wins, only the winning squad can participate in the tie breaker to advance to the next round. Also, the bottom team in the bracket will call the coin toss and be able to choose individual match ups within the bracket. There will again be a coin flip in case of a tie breaker.
9. Each game will be played to twenty-one points. However, the skunk rule will be in effect. If any team scores eleven points before their opponent scores one point, the game is over. Final score would be (11-0).
10. The Sierra Nevada Athletic Commission will allow alcohol, smoking and chewing during this tournament event.



SNC BOWLING TOURNAMENT RULES

Method of play and rules:

1. Teams will begin round one play based on Thursday night bracket seeding.
2. The teams that win in the first round will advance to the second round and either the title or consolation games via match play.

OVERALL TOURNAMENT SCORING RULES

1 st Place In An Individual Event.....	4 Points
2 nd Place In An Individual Event.....	3 Points
3 rd Place In An Individual Event.....	2 Points
4 th Place In An Individual Event.....	1 Point

Tiebreaker

If the day ends with a tie for first place in the overall tournament, a bowl-off will be implemented to determine the champion. Then, in order to determine the overall finish other than first, total points and then total bowling average will be used to rank teams.

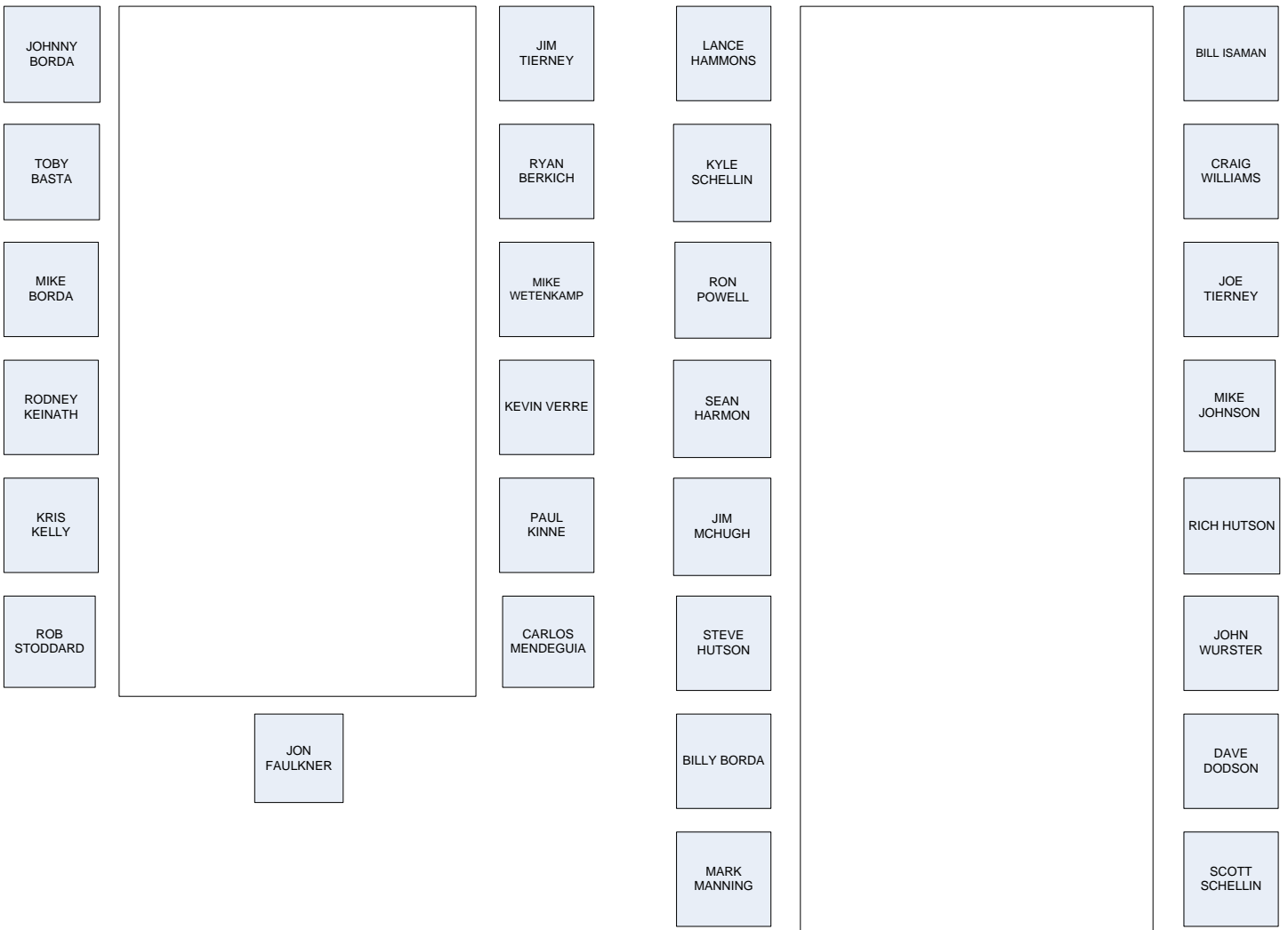
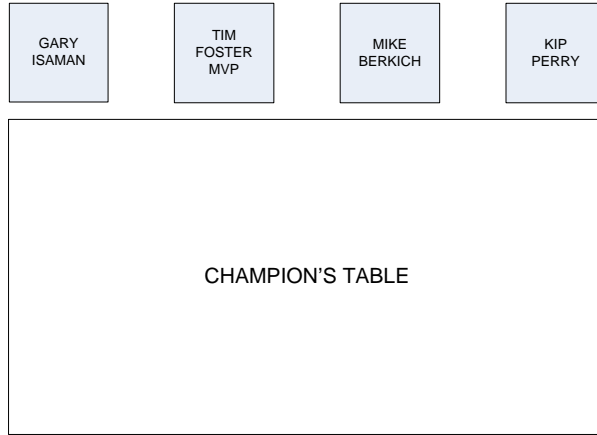

PENETRATORS

YEARS IN LEAGUE: 16

CHAMPIONSHIPS: 4 (1996, 1998, 2008, 2011)

2011 Sierra Nevada Classic - Champions (1st Place Horseshoes, 1st Place Bowling)

If ownership of the Penetrators was told last year just days prior to SNC 16 that they would win their fourth SNC Championship, they would have belly laughed all the way back to team headquarters. Team members were notified by ownership a week prior to the tournament that they would be without their team Captain Kip Perry, a fifteen year veteran, and team member Matt Franz, a six year veteran. Despite the odds of competing with only two players against teams with four players, SNC Veterans Mike Berkich and Tim Foster laced up the shoes and dug in for the long haul of tournament weekend. Both Berkich and Foster were handicapped from the beginning on their first event due to the fact they could only use two shots per turn against teams with four shots per turn. Despite these overwhelming odds, they pulled off a great round that placed them fifth on the course, just out of the points. The two man team blazed through the Horseshoe tournament and went into half time with four impressive points and tied for the lead with two other teams for first place. With the tournament title in their sights, the two man machine turned up the heat and screamed through to the bowling title like a high desert wild fire. After the smoke had cleared, The Penetrators hoisted their fourth SNC Championship Trophy and rode into the night with a well deserved victory.



Kip "Greez" Perry - Captain (MVP - 2008, 1998)

After a year sabbatical from his squad, Perry will attempt to get back in the good graces of his teammates and lead them to consecutive titles. SNC 17 will be the first time Perry will enter a tournament with a year off from the event. He will need to prove to himself and to his team that he still has the veteran fire he has carried and one time even worn over fifteen years in the tournament. Look for Perry to again struggle on the golf course with an average game at best, but to help his team in shoes and as always to be a solid piece on the best bowling team in the league.



Mike "Paw" Berkich (MVP - 2006)

Berkich cruises into SNC 17 with a huge smile and now two SNC Titles under his belt as he captained his second franchise to the title. He was a major part of the team's one-two punch that led to the Penetrator victory. His golf game was above average during last year's tournament where five of his tee shots were used along with ten of his putts during the round. His shoes were a main reason they took home the title in horseshoes with several ringers and points in their eight games played. Per normal, Paw was dominant at the bowling alley where his three game average of 158.33 secured their victory on the lanes to shut the door and lock up the title.



Tim "The Flame" Foster (MVP - 2011)

What this kid did in SNC 16 will go down in tournament history. He was a unanimous decision for the highly sought after MVP Trophy and secured his second Championship Trophy. He did everything in his power on the golf course where thirteen of his tee shots were used along with eight of his putts. He was the bookend of his team in horseshoes that fought like a prize fighter for twelve rounds to secure first place in the event. After lunch and a confirmed five picons, The Flame would save the best for last. In true PBA fashion, he went on to average 239.33 in his three games bowled. He finished the tourney day with an impressive 259 in the final game and raised the cup with his teammate and celebrated with a pitcher of White Russians.



Gary "Bacon" Isaman (Rookie)

After the last minute pull out of Matt Franz prior to SNC 16, ownership of The Penetrators were forced to do their homework during the off season to not only sign a stellar athlete, but more importantly, a guy that could quickly gel with this veteran team. After an extensive search they found their man and signed Gary "Bacon" Isaman out of the DS-21 league to an undisclosed amount. Not signed for his golf stroke or production of bacon in hogs, the rookie Isaman will struggle to get his two required tee shots during the round, but with an above average horseshoe game the squad shouldn't miss a beat in the pits. After the five picon limit at lunch, the bowling alley will be his true test. As with all rookies in the league, the performance after half time will be the measuring stick for the inaugural year.

2012 Prediction: 1st Place

Since the new realignment starting in 2009 with SNC 14, this team has dominated and they will again finish in first in bowling. With a full squad in this year's tourney and a well above average golf and horseshoe game, the sky is the limit for the Penetrators. With a championship win in SNC 17, the Penetrators will tie the Point Shavers with most SNC Titles with five.



LET IT RIDE

YEAR IN LEAGUE: 14

CHAMPIONSHIPS: 0

2011 Sierra Nevada Classic – 2nd Place (2nd Place Golf, 4th Place Horseshoes, 3rd Place Bowling)

What a magical year it was during SNC 16 for Let It Ride. They were the only team in the tournament to place in all three events. If it wasn't for a semifinal loss to the Penetrators in horseshoes, Let It Ride would have likely taken home their first SNC Title. Since the four player format began in 2009, this team has steadily climbed the ladder. Starting with a last place finish in SNC 14, this team improved to a fifth place finish in SNC 15 and now a second place finish in SNC 16. The weekend got off to a great start for this veteran team as they shot an impressive 68 at Wolf Run to finish with a second place. The horseshoe tournament was just as impressive as they ended with a fourth place finish and in the semifinal playoff bracket, the team of Basta/Tierney lost by only one shoe to the eventual champs, The Penetrators. Also after lunch, Let it Ride would go on to have their best ever day in bowling with a third place finish. If they can continue on their current path, look for Let It Ride to be vying for their first ever title in SNC 17.



Johnny "The JB" Borda - Captain

Captain Borda returns to this year's tournament with a pep in his step that hasn't been seen since his last tournament title way back in 1996 when he was a member of the Penetrators. Although his team took second place in golf last year, not many of his shots were used with only three tee shots and three putts being tallied. He did all he could pitching shoes, but his split squad with Gorko only recorded one victory in three matches. After yet another strong lunch outing at the JT, The JB would finish strong with his best bowling tournament of his career as he averaged 131.33 at the alley to help his squad capture third place honors.



Jim "Chilinch" Tierney (MVP – 2004)

Once again, Chilinch would bring his A game to the course on tournament day. What this kid does on the course each and every year is a sight to see as his golf game has arguably risen to tops in the league where his fairway percentage is number one. He was the anchor of his team with ten of his tee shots being used along with four of his putts. He was just as impressive in the horseshoe tournament where his split squad team with The Serb went 2-2 and nearly took his team to the final bracket with a 20-21 loss to the Penetrators. Tierney, like his captain, would bowl the best of his career at the Grand Sierra with a three game average of 150.33 to help his team to a third place finish on the lanes to end the tourney.



Toby "The Serb" Basta

The Serb again laced up the golf shoes and headed to an event that is not one of his strong suites as his team used only three of his drives during the round. However, the six putts dropped for his team was one of the reasons they finished in second place on the course. In horseshoes, Basta along with his split squad teammate Chilinch would be a key figure in helping the team advance out of the quarterfinals and to an eventual fourth place finish. Several ringers and points during the three matchups would turn out to make SNC 16 the best of The Serb's career. Another career highlight for Basta was at the bowling alley where he would bowl an impressive 132 average in three games.



Ryan "Gorko" Berkich (ROY – 2007)

Usually a dominate force on the golf course for Let It Ride, Gorko struggled on the round were only two of his drives were used. Even though his long game wasn't clicking, he helped out big on the greens with five of his putts being scored. His horseshoe performance was average where his split squad team with his captain could only muster one win on the day. After a strong showing at lunch, Gorko would go on to bowl the best games of his life with a three game average of 145.33. If he can maintain this kind of average in SNC 17, it could be the key to Let It Ride's first tournament victory.

2012: Prediction: 4th Place

Placing in all three events in SNC 16 shows this team is poised to take home the title. Points in golf for this team have become a yearly happening and with the improvement in both horseshoes and bowling, this team has finally hit their stride. However, again placing in all three events may be a bit of a stretch for any team.



STAGE FRIGHT

YEARS IN LEAGUE: 15

CHAMPIONSHIPS: 0

2011 Sierra Nevada Classic – 3rd Place (1st Place Golf)

Stage Fright enters SNC 17 as longest running franchise without a SNC Title. It has been fifteen long years for this veteran team without hoisting the trophy. But the future does look bright as they have greatly improved since the new format started in SNC 14. With a seventh place finish in SNC 14, a fourth place finish in SNC 15 and a third place finish in SNC 16, the promised land may be just around the corner. Last year got off to a promising start for Stage Fright with a first place finish at Wolf Run with an impressive 65. Yet the next morning their tournament hopes took a turn for the worse when their nemesis, the horseshoe event, again left them one and done. In the three years of the horseshoe tournament, Stage Fright has yet to advance out of the first round. Yet, heading into halftime, Stage Fright was confident as they were in a three way tie for first place. Ownership was not sure if it was the picons or too many side dishes at the JT, but whatever it was, the first round loss to Let It Ride in bowling shattered Stage Fright's chances of winning their first title and sent them into the off season shaking their heads.



Lance "Yeti" Hammons – Captain (MI -2004)

With a full bodysuit of hair, Yeti emerges out of the forest for his once a year journey into town. Hammons again brought his F game to the course during SNC 16 where the two minimum drives were used. However, the Yeti enjoyed some success on the greens where the team needed five of his putts. Next up for the captain was the dreaded horseshoe tournament, and again like all horseshoe brackets, Stage Fright took the early exit and were yanked off the stage. After snacks, Yeti headed into his last and strongest event of bowling and looked to help his squad advance out of the quarterfinals. But it just wasn't meant to be as his only game of 117 was well below his average and he headed back to the cave to hibernate for another season.



Bill "Da Whala" Isaman (ROY-1997)

Da Whala floated into town for the fifteenth time last year and again would be a key piece of this solid golf team. Five of his drives were used along with three of his putts and several other key shots on the round to give his team a first place victory on the course. Next was the thorn in Da Whala's fin, the horseshoe tournament. Rumored to be tops in the league during the SNC Draft back in 2009, he has yet to live up to the top pitcher in the league prediction, and again was one and done in the quarterfinals in 2011. Still, heading into the final event tied for first place, this bowler who is usually one of the best in the league, could only muster a 134 in the quarterfinal round and would need to head to the emergency room for a blow hole fracture that has taken the entire off season to heal.



Kyle "Leroy" Schellin (MI – 2003, ROY – 2001)

Leroy cruised into SNC 17 with the most off season free time he has had in years. After retiring from a coaching career that included two 4A State Titles, four 4A League Championships, and an overall 134-67 record, look for Leroy's golf game to be vastly improved. Last year on the course was an average round for Schellin where only three of his drives and four of his putts were used. Like his teammates he was rudely ousted from the horseshoe tournament where he and his split squad teammate Lurch exited with a 13-21 loss to From The Brickyard. After lunch and a confirmed six O'Douls, Leroy would head to the bowling alley where his career average is not so good. A quarterfinal score of 103 was not what the doctor ordered, and he would join the rest of Stage Fright for the eleventh frame in the lounge.



Craig "Lurch" Williams (ROY - 2008)

Lurch again came to golf early and often at Wolf Run and would go on to play the best round of his SNC career where eight of his drives and six of his putts were used to secure his team's first place finish on the course. Yet what he did for his squad in golf, he didn't do for them in horseshoes as it was another tough loss for Lurch in the pits where he and his partner exited very early on Saturday morning. But even after a tough morning, he performed well at lunch and headed to the lanes with his team in the driver's seat for a tournament title. He did everything he could with an impressive 134, but the lack of help from the rest of Stage Fright put a screeching halt to any title hopes in SNC 17.

2012 Prediction: 3rd Place

Look for Stage Fright to again place in the top two in golf. The inconsistent play in horseshoes the last three years will be the hump they need to conquer and they will also need to improve on the lanes to have any shot at the trophy.



POINT SHAVERS

YEARS IN THE LEAGUE: 16

CHAMPIONSHIPS: 5 (1997, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002)

2011 Sierra Nevada Classic – 4th Place (2nd Place Bowling)

The Point Shavers again got off to a rocky start in SNC 17 where they didn't tally any points in the first two events. Going into SNC 16 with only three players was already a tough hurdle for this team to overcome, but losing one of their best golfers and their best horseshoe pitchers to an Evel Kenevil stunt accident had this team predicted last for SNC 16. After a lunch, were surprisingly, all team members were able to walk back to the bus, the three amigos headed to the lanes where they have experienced years and years of disappointment. However, just when ownership expected another early bowling exit, this once mighty franchise did the unthinkable, finished second in bowling and rose from the ashes to a fourth place overall finish.



Mike “The Silent Assassin” Borda – Captain (MVP – 2002, 2000, 1999, 1996)

The Assassin again brought his silent golf game to another tournament in SNC 16. The three of his required tee shots were used only because they needed to be, not because they were the best balls. The putting green wasn't much better with only five of his putts being used. Again in horseshoes, Borda would struggle with the shoes and take two loses in the quarterfinals to have his team exit without a point going into halftime. After the JT, where his lunch is spent monitoring teammates booze consumption, he headed to the lanes which used to be the best part of his day but over the last several years have become unwatchable. Just when ownership thought the best of their captain's bowling days were over, he showed shades of his glory days with an impressive 160.33 average in three games.



Mike “Goose” Wetenkamp (MI -2008)

Goose spent SNC 16 on injured reserve after his shoulder was shattered into more pieces than a 1,000 piece jigsaw puzzle. After an off season of grueling rehab that consisted of nightly extra large portions of red meat and beer, the Goose is as fit as a Thanksgiving Turkey. Watching SNC 16 from the sidelines may have been a blessing in disguise for this veteran team. Wetenkamp may have regained that fire in his eyes and will dominate like years past in both golf and horseshoes. His bowling game as always will be a work in progress but he should be passed the days of wearing his work boots on the lanes.



Rodney “Spiderman” Keinath (MVP – 2001, 1997)

After two disappointing seasons in SNC 14 and SNC 15 on the golf course, Spiderman took it upon himself to turn his game around. No one has played more rounds of golf the last two years than this kid and his play in SNC 16 was music to team ownership's ears as he shot the best round of his tournament life. Six drives and four putts were used by Keinath on tourney day and look for this to only improve at this year's golf event. Like his captain, Keinath struggled in the horseshoe pits and would hang up the shoes before they were even dusty. After a strong lunch, Keinath would cruise into the Grand Sierra looking for the magic that awarded him two MVP Honors and five Champions Titles. He started on a positive note with a 146 in the quarterfinal, but the next two scores of 126 and 108 left the veteran with a bitter taste in his mouth.



Kevin “Special K” Verre

Special K returns to SNC 17 as the ring leader of the golf event for the Point Shavers. He was used early and often by his team with nine of his drives and nine of his putts being recorded. In fact, there wasn't a bad shot on the entire round. Like his teammates Borda and Keinath, horseshoes was an event where they might have done better if they had slept in. Lunch for Special K can be hit or miss at times in his career, but in SNC 16 it was a hit and Verre sailed through lunch without any major incidents. Another dicey event for Verre in the past has been bowling, but like lunch during SNC 16, he slid through the event with the best three rounds of his career. By totaling an average of 121.33 in three games bowled he was a key part in the team taking second place at the alley.

2012 Prediction: 5th Place

Although the days of last place finishes for this veteran team may be a thing of the past, getting back to winning the title may be a bit of a stretch. They will need to play out of their minds to get any points in golf. Wetenkamp will need to get back to his number one status in horseshoes for them to have a chance at points in the pits. But if they can mirror their performance in SNC 16 on the lanes, there may be a top three finish in their immediate future.



FROM THE BRICKYARD

YEARS IN LEAGUE: 13

CHAMPIONSHIPS: 0

2011 Sierra Nevada Classic – 5th Place (2nd Place Horseshoes)

SNC 16 was another step in the right direction for the Brickyard with a fifth place finish during the tournament. However, golf for this team is still a work in progress where they finished tied for second to last place at day's end with a score of 76. After another disappointing year in golf, the Brickyard didn't hang their heads and they plowed through the horseshoe tournament before a final loss to the eventual champion Penetrators. Heading into lunch with an impressive three points, the day certainly looked bright for this franchise that has yet to win a championship since its inception back in 1999. So after a solid showing at half time they headed to the Grand Sierra to go for it all. Unfortunately, the day and tournament ended on a sour note as they were rudely ousted from the first round by the Point Shavers and sent off to the lounge to participate in the next three rounds of bowling as spectators.



Ron "Silk" Powell – Captain (ROY – 1999)

Captain Powell "enjoyed" another long day on the course at Wolf Run in SNC 16 where only three of his tee shots were used along with three of his putts. However, on the positive side for SNC 17, Powell is rumored to have picked up his own set of clubs during the off season but whether or not he took them out of the bag is another matter. Silk along with his split squad teammate Sleepy did some major damage in the horseshoe pits where they cruised through the first two rounds with ease before they lost a tough fought match 14 – 21 to team Berkich/Foster in the finals. The loss in horseshoes might have taken some of his mojo as he struggled in the last event of the day where he bowled well below his SNC Average with a score of 117.



Joe "Casanova" Tierney (MVP -2005, ROY -2000)

It was another solid year for Casanova on the course where he took the rest of From The Brickyard on his shoulders and contributed nine drives along with 10 putts. Moving on to the horseshoe pits the next day, he and his split squad teammate Southie did some major work in the dirt knocking out two tough opponents en route to the finals. Yet, they might have used all their jam to defeat the favored Colt .45s in the semis as they suffered a crushing 5 – 21 defeat to Berkich/Foster in the finals. Even with the horseshoe loss, this one time MVP and two time Champion knew heading into lunch with three points would have them knocking on the door for a title. But the lanes were not welcoming or maybe the picons had an extra bite, as Casanova bowled a meager 109 at the Grand Sierra and joined his team in the audience.



Sean "Southie" Harmon

Southie was not drafted to From The Brickyard for his golf game and like three fourths of his squad would struggle on the course where only three of his tee shots and one of his putts were used. With golf gladly behind him, Southie awoke Saturday morning to take out some frustration on the horseshoe stakes as he and Casanova constantly clinked metal for two rounds before coming up short in the finals. As a major part of his team's three points, Harmon was riding high with confidence at lunch and hoped to channel that to his bowling ball. Typically an anchor for his team on the lanes with a 134 SNC average, Southie couldn't find the magic and exited the first round with an uninspired 109.



Mike "Sleepy" Johnson (ROY 2002)

SNC 16 looked to be a promising year for Sleepy in golf. With an entire off season of weekly rounds with his partner in crime Spiderman, he looked to take some of the weight off Casanova's back and get the Brickyard out of the cellar in the golf event. Maybe it was the nerves or maybe the off season golf outings were heavy on the 19th hole, but whatever the reason, only three of his drives and three of his putts were taken. He, like his teammates, made a mad push for first place in horseshoes and was one of the main reasons they made it all the way to the finals with several ringers and key points. During half time, Sleepy would come in first place. With an appetite like a Viking two months at sea, he would dominate the side dishes and help any member out finishing their entrée. He felt good going into bowling where he has excelled in the past, but maybe the red meat caught up with him as he rolled well below his career average with a score of 118.

2012 Prediction: 6th Place

Just like SNC 16, From The Brickyard is again picked to end up in the sixth spot. They will need to again dominate in horseshoes and pick up points bowling to make it in the top five again. Golf for this team will need the stars to be aligned for any points to occur.



FULL HOUSE

YEARS IN LEAGUE: 10

Championships: 3 (2007, 2009, 2010)

2011 Sierra Nevada Classic – 6th Place (3rd Place Golf)

Again Full House would show up in the most colorful golf uniforms of the day, but unlike the last two years where they dominated on the course and secured first place victories, they hit a bit of a snag at Wolf Run with a third place finish and a score of 70. Not the way the reigning champions wanted to begin their attempt at a three-peat and it would carry on to horseshoes where they bowed out early in the first round with a loss to the favored Colt .45s. Still, with two points headed into the final event in the alley where Full House has a solid history of success, they were ready to make their move for the elusive third straight title. But it wasn't in the cards for Full House in SNC 16 as they would lose to the eventual champion Penetrators in the first round and enter uncharted territory as bystanders to the title.



Kris "Skeets" Kelly – Captain (MVP – 2010)

Captain Skeets would again have a solid day on the course with six of his drives being used. Most likely not the best round for him during his SNC Career, but even the pros have bad days. Look for him to rebound strong in SNC 17 with new attire and a championship golf game. He did everything he could in horseshoes with his split squad teammate Bor but lost a tough fought battle 19 – 21 in the first round against McHugh/Wurster to exit early out of the pits. However, his confidence was still riding high heading into bowling where his career average is near the top in the league, but a score of 134 was not what his team needed and would he have to wait until next year for more rounds of his signature splits.



Rob "Bor" Stoddard

Like his captain, Bor would golf a solid round where six of his drives and eight of his putts were used. And also like his captain was not happy with the pace on the course or a third place finish in SNC 16. Look for the tusks to be nice and sharp come tee time in SNC 17 as he exacts some revenge on the rest of the teams. He had several key shots in the 19-21 lose in the quarterfinals of horseshoes, but came up just a bit shy to notch any points. After a solid lunch at the JT he was eager to get to the lanes where he has experienced tremendous success over the years. He again would not disappoint and did all he could with an impressive score of 156, but the lack of support from the rest of Full House ended any chance for a three-peat.



Paul "Packsand" Kinne (MVP 2009, MI 2006)

After two years of success on the greens for Packsand, he was a few handfuls short during SNC 16. Only two of his drives and three of his putts were used during the entire round. Moving on to horseshoes in his college backyard, he and his teammate the Apostle barely wiped the sleep out of their eyes before ending their day with a 10-21 loss to the Colt .45s. After taking out his frustrations on a Basque family style lunch and picnics he still had his sights on another SNC Trophy. But unlike the past MVP type seasons on the lanes, Packsand would leave the Grand Sierra empty handed with a lackluster score of 103 as he watched the rest of the bowling tournament with watery eyes.



Carlos "The Apostle" Mendeguia

The Apostle did everything he could with his average golf game to help out Full House during SNC 16. His team used four of his drives along with five of his putts which would normally have this team sitting in first place come the end of the day. He like Packsand would struggle early and often in the quarterfinal horseshoe match where they could only muster a total of 10 points. After lunch he, like his teammates, were confident for the three-peat. He was riding high when they hit the Grand Sierra since his bowling game has drastically improved over the last three years. He would not disappoint and would finish with an impressive 132, but all was for not as the Apostle and Full House would end the day with no chance for a title.

2012 Prediction: 2nd Place

Don't look for another year with Full House out of the first place spot at the end of golf. They will come back strong to get their title back. Their horseshoe history really has to be their only concern as they will also bounce back in bowling and make a strong push for their fourth title.



COLT .45s

YEARS IN LEAUGE: 12

CHAMPIONSHIPS: 1 (2004)

2011 Sierra Nevada Classic – 7th Place (3rd Place Horseshoes)

Mayday! Mayday! The Colt 45s may be sinking. Dropping from a third place overall finish in SNC 15 to a seventh place finish in SNC 16 is cause for major concern for a squad who has experienced success since the new format began in SNC 14. One thing did not change for this squad however, their golf game continued to be unwatchable with a score of 79. After golf, the Colt 45s looked forward to a new day and the comfort of the horseshoe tournament where they are the two time defending champions. They started the event strong with a victory in the quarterfinals against Full House, but would trip up in the Semis with a loss to From The Brickyard. They would salvage the day with a consolation victory over Let It Ride and head into half time still having a shot if they could finish strong in bowling. Matched up against Fistfull of \$\$\$ in the quarterfinals had them licking their chops, but they lost by 46 pins in a stunning upset and would head to the lounge to drown their sorrows.



Jim “2-4-2” McHugh – Captain

McHugh will slip on the docksiders for another year in the Classic and attempt to get his squad back to a respectable finish on tournament weekend. Look for him to again bring a subpar golf game to the new course at Genoa Lakes since there really isn't a club in this guy's bag that works as shown by only two of his drives and two of his putts being used for the entire round. In horseshoes he and his split squad teammate would start off hot with a quarterfinal win of 21 – 19 against Full House, but would lose steam in the semis and would settle for an overall 3rd place finish. After lunch, a stop which has never harmed this veteran captain, he would waltz into his comfort zone of the bowling alley. With so much success in years past, 2-4-2 may have been over confident as he struggled to a 124 and was one and done.



Rich “All World” Huston (MVP -2007)

All World would return for the Colt 45s as their ace in the hole on the course. That ace however, may have been a joker for this squad, since only three of his drives were used on the day. But on the bright side, Hutson notched eight putts for his team. Unfortunately, most of the putts were bogeys. He would again enjoy success in the horseshoe tournament where other than a small glitch in the semifinals, he and his split squad teammate Wheels would take two out of three brackets on the day to capture some points. After lunch at the JT can be hit or miss for the SNC Vet and luckily SNC 16 was a hit as he would go on to bowl a respectable 131. But it wasn't enough as he made his way to the bar and saddled up.



John “Shortstack” Wurster

You can count on Shortstack to get as many swings as he can during the eighteen holes at Genoa Lakes this year. The human rain delay likes his practice swings and they helped him come up big for his team during SNC 16 where eight of his tee shots and five of his putts were used. He, along with his captain, had a great day in the pits and secured the team two important points going into half time. After lunch, where this kid continues to defy the odds of five picons with a weight of 130, he would stroll into the Grand Sierra for the final event of the day. Unlike his last three years of withering bowling scores, Shortstack would bounce back with an impressive 142 in the first round. But the lack of support from most of his squad would help to produce an early exit.



Steve “Wheels” Hutson (ROY -2009)

Wheels would do what he could on the course at Wolf Run where five of his drives and three of his putts were used during the round. After his team's last place finish on the course, he was excited to get into the horseshoe pits where he is arguably the top pitcher in the tournament supported by his all time lead in ringers. He again cruised through the quarterfinal round to advance to the semifinals, but for the first time since his inception into the league, he would not secure a first place finish and would have to settle for a consolation victory as he boarded the shuttle to the Nugget. Although he has fond memories of lunch at JT, Wheels would like to forget the Grand Sierra as he bowled a listless 114 to finish his day and head to the eleventh frame.

2011 Prediction: 7th Place

With an abysmal golf game, the Colt .45s may need a miracle to ever secure any points in the first event. Although teams in the league now know that they are vulnerable in horseshoes, look for them to still be the heavy favorite. As shown during SNC 16, they can be hit or miss in the bowling alley which may lead to another bottom of the road finish.



FISTFUL OF \$\$\$

YEARS IN LEAGUE: 16

CHAMPIONSHIPS: 2 (2003, 2005)

2011 Sierra Nevada Classic – Last Place (4th Place Golf, 4th Place Bowling)

For the second year in a row, this once dominant franchise ended the day in last place. Since this veteran squad counts on golf for points, the tournament started off rough as Fistful was only able to scratch out a fourth place finish. They came out of the gates hot in horseshoes forcing a tie-breaker with eventual champion Penetrators but ran out of juice and ended their day in the pits losing 7 – 21. After lunch, sporting a glossy feeling of euphoria, they headed to the Grand Sierra, where the lanes have not been friendly to them in the past. But unlike years past they would come together in the alley and bowl the best team game of their recent history and upset the favorite Colt .45s in the quarterfinals. Once in the points bracket, they came back down to earth and were crushed by a rejuvenated Point Shavers team by 102 pins and then humiliated by Let It Ride to the tune of 118 pins. Another disappointing year in the cellar has sent this team back to the drawing board.



Billy “Dot” Borda – Captain (MVP -2003)

Captain Dot would like to forget last year’s golf tournament where he only contributed three drives and five putts. He started off on fire with his split squad teammate Manning in horseshoes winning their first quarterfinal match against the Penetrators 21 – 7. After a hearty lunch, he would go on to take control in the first round of bowling with an impressive 150 game, but he may have shot his wad as he then bowled a pitiful 100 in the semifinals. In the consolation bracket, he would rebound with a 123, but it was too little, too late as his team finished in last place for the second straight year.



Dave “The Stormin’ X-Mormon” Dodson

As expected, the X-Mormon would do all he could to get his team into points in golf as eleven of his drives and five of his putts were used on the day. If it wasn’t for this kid, this team would never crack last place on the course. Next, Dodson and his teammate the Leprechaun pushed Foster/Berkich to the brink in horseshoes before losing a nail biter in the first round 18 – 21. The Ex-Mormon would cruise through lunch and hit the lanes in fine fashion where he would start the event with a 155, an impressive game that was well above his Classic average. This pattern was very short lived however, as his next two games of 109 and 98 helped his team cement last place.



Mark “Ziggy” Manning

Ziggy struggled early and often at Wolf Run during SNC 16, where only two of his drives were used along with four of his putts. He is still yearning for the success he produced during SNC 14 where his golf putt secured his team a tie breaker for second place. Along with his teammate Dot, he started the day strong with several key points and ringers to get the early victory, but a loss in the tiebreaker was a tough pill to swallow. Ziggy would then move on to his favorite event of the day, lunch at JT. He savored the delicious entrees and sides then headed to the Grand Sierra to savor some bowling pins. He started off well with a 129, a score that was huge in advancing his team out of the first round, but the next two scores of 113 and 112 left a little to be desired and helped keep Fistful in the cellar.



Scott “The Leprechaun” Schellin (MI -2002)

Not ready for the PGA Tour anytime soon, The Leprechaun again gave it all he had but could only muster two drives and four putts on the day. It was also one and done for him on the horseshoe pits as he ended the first two events of the tournament with a bitter taste in his mouth that could only be removed by the sweet taste of picon punch. After lunch, The Leprechaun stared drunkenly through his teammates and promised to contribute on the lanes and knock some pins the f down. Call it the luck of the Irish, but he did just that with a score of 124, one of the best of his Classic career. He would go on to bowl an even better 128 in the Semifinals before the picons wore off and he settled back down to a 103 in the consolation matchup.

2012 Prediction: Last Place

This team is in Trouble with a capital “T”. If they can’t get back on track with a top two or three finish in golf, they may be languishing in the bottom half of the standings for years to come. Anything more than fourth place finishes for this team in horseshoes or bowling will always be a stretch.
