The Commission reached out to me and asked if I could write a little bit about our good friend Roneil “Silk” Powell and I was humbled and honored to share a story.

Almost 23 years ago to the day I was sitting in my Pennafort dorm room at Dominican College that I shared with a Norwegian tennis player and a Muslim Royal. To say that I was depressed would be an understatement. I had been at school for nearly two weeks and hadn't met anyone I got along with like my friends I had grown up with in Carson City. I was homesick and would spend most of my days alone trying to perfect a baseball video game on my Macintosh Classic with little success. When a knock came at the door I was surprised, when I answered there stood Ron Powell. I had met him briefly at a small dorm room party the night before but wasn't even sure he remembered my name. He asked what I was doing and I told him I was just playing a baseball game on my computer and asked if he wanted to play. “Sounds awesome!” he said.

Truth be told the computer had been kicking my ass in the game and I was ready to dole out some punishment on someone. I gave him a run down and showed him the key strokes and he was ready to go, so I threw him a fastball. He hit a home run. I had been playing this damn game for two weeks and had never hit a home run. Lucky shot I thought. So next pitch I threw the curve I had mastered. Another home run. I think he could tell I didn't like how this was going and I can't remember if I even threw another pitch before he said, “This game is pretty cool, but I came by to see if you wanted to come hang out on the lawn in front of the library with everybody.”

That was Roneil. He was always making you feel better or making the situation better in some way. Within a week we were roommates. He took me under his wing and showed me the ropes at Dominican, introducing me to everybody, and I mean everybody, because he knew everyone on campus. Ron is one of those rare people who could relate to anyone and I learned more from him than I would ever let him know. He was like a big brother who kept me protected and helped me to grow into a better person. I was blessed that I was able spend the majority of my adult life along side of him because Ron was an amazing person and the definition of a true friend.



Gentlemen,

As we again gather in the Carson Valley, the tragic losses of Ron “Silk” Powell and Mike “The Silent Assassin” Borda will be on all of our hearts and minds. It still doesn’t seem possible that two of our brothers could be taken from us so early in their youth.

This year, Sierra Nevada Classic 19 will be dedicated to Ron and as we all know him, he would want all of us to take advantage of this time together to laugh, to drink, to eat and to play.

During these trying times, the Sierra Nevada Athletic Commission would like to thank all of the athletes for taking the time out of their busy lives to dedicate themselves to this tournament of camaraderie, friendship and brotherhood.

Below is a list of official changes that have been implemented by the Commission for the 19th Annual Sierra Nevada Classic.

Official changes are as follows:

- 1) Thirteen-year veteran Roneil “Silk” Powell joins the Silent Assassin in the Sierra Nevada Classic Heaven League. Unanimously becomes fourth member of SNC Hall Of Fame.
- 2) From The Brickyard team name is changed to Powell’s Brickyard.
- 3) Joe “Casanova” Tierney becomes new captain of Powell’s Brickyard which will compete with three members in this year’s Classic.
- 4) Sierra Nevada Classic Member Toby “The Serb” Basta will receive the Decade of Service Award.
- 5) Rookie Tully “The Colonel” Wyatt finishes his tour of duty and signs with the Point Shavers.
- 6) In his free agent year, Ryan “Gorko” Berkich’s contract is picked up by the Arizona Cactus League.
- 7) Rookie Scott “Matlock” Gilles passes the bar and joins Let It Ride.
- 8) Bowling will be moving back to Carson Lanes after a three year hiatus.

Scramble Rules

Method of play and rules:

1. Play begins with each member of the group teeing off.
2. With the agreement of the other members of the group, the team captain decides which drive is the most desirable.
3. The other members of the group pick up their balls and proceed to the spot of the selected drive, where they will hit their second (or third, or fourth, etc. shot).
4. After the shot, all balls may be placed within one club length of the original ball. This may be done either to the side or backwards. Balls may not be placed closer to the hole.
5. In placing the ball, you may not change the condition of the shot. If the ball is in a hazard (e.g. sand trap, rough) all members of the team must play their shot from the trap or rough, respectively.
6. This procedure continues until the ball is in the hole.
7. On the putting green, **do not hole out a short putt if you have missed your first putt.** The first ball putted must count. Mark your ball and wait. If the second or third putt is better, mark that putt. Under no circumstances will there be any gimmies.
8. At the end of each hole, the score for the group is recorded on the card.
9. All scorecards must be kept accurately and per hole.
10. Each player on the team must contribute at least **two** tee shots per 18 holes. If only three members are on a team, **three** tee shots must be used per 18 holes. When recording your score on the card, you must input which player's tee shot was used on every hole. Also mark down which member of your team made the putt.
11. The maximum score allowed is a double-par. After that, simply pick up the balls and move on to the next hole.



SNC Horseshoe Tournament Rules

Method of play and rules:

1. All court layout dimensions, playing equipment and scoring will follow the official rules sanctioned by the NHPA (National Horseshoe Pitchers Association of America).
2. Cancellation scoring will be used to keep score during the tournament.
3. Ringer: Ringers cancel each other. A ringer of one contestant shall cancel a ringer of another contestant and those shoes shall not score any points. Any uncanceled (live) ringers shall score 3 points.
4. Shoes in Count: A shoe in count (upright horseshoe length from the stake) shall score one point under the following conditions: If there are cancelled ringers and no live ringer, the closest shoe in count to the stake shall score one point. If there are no ringers, the closest shoe in count to the stake shall score one point. If the other shoe of the same contestant is the second closest shoe in count, it shall also score one point. If there is one uncanceled ringer and the other shoe of the scoring contestant is the closest shoe in count to the stake, it shall score one point (four points total).
5. On tournament day, there will be one scorekeeper per game. This score sheet shall be the official record of the game. Contestants are encouraged to pay close attention to the score at all times. If a question or discrepancy occurs regarding the score, the contestant(s) may approach the scorekeeper between innings to rectify the situation. This scorekeeper or other identified authority will also judge any discrepancy of which contestants shoes are closer to the stakes during the game. If discrepancies cannot be corrected to the satisfaction of all contestants, the tournament judge shall be called in to make the final decision.
6. Each team will be comprised of four pitchers. Each team will be selected into an eight team bracket that will be drawn on seeding night.
7. The Horseshoe Tournament will begin with your team dividing into two teams of two contestants. **(These teams must be determined before seeding)**. Your two teams will be matched against the other team in your bracket who will also divide their team into two teams of two contestants.
8. Please note that your "A" squad will match up with your opponents "A" squad along with "B" squad vs. "B" squad in your individual bracket. If both of your split squads win, you advance out of bracket. If one squad loses and the other wins, only the winning squad can participate in the tie breaker to advance to the next round. Also, the bottom team in the bracket will call the coin toss and be able to choose individual match ups within the bracket. There will again be a coin flip in case of a tie breaker.
9. Each game will be played to twenty-one points (First team to twenty-one, no need to win by two points). However, the skunk rule will be in effect. If any team scores eleven points before their opponent scores one point, the game is over. Final score would be (11-0).
10. The Sierra Nevada Athletic Commission will allow alcohol, smoking and chewing during this tournament event.



SNC Bowling Tournament Rules

Method of play and rules:

1. Teams will begin round one play based on Thursday night bracket seeding.
2. The teams that win in the first round will advance to the second round and either the title or consolation games via match play.

Overall Tournament Scoring Rules

1 st Place In An Individual Event.....	4 Points
2 nd Place In An Individual Event.....	3 Points
3 rd Place In An Individual Event.....	2 Points
4 th Place In An Individual Event.....	1 Point

Tiebreaker

If the day ends with a tie for first place in the overall tournament, a bowl-off will be implemented to determine the champion. Then, in order to determine the overall finish other than first, total points and then total bowling average will be used to rank teams.

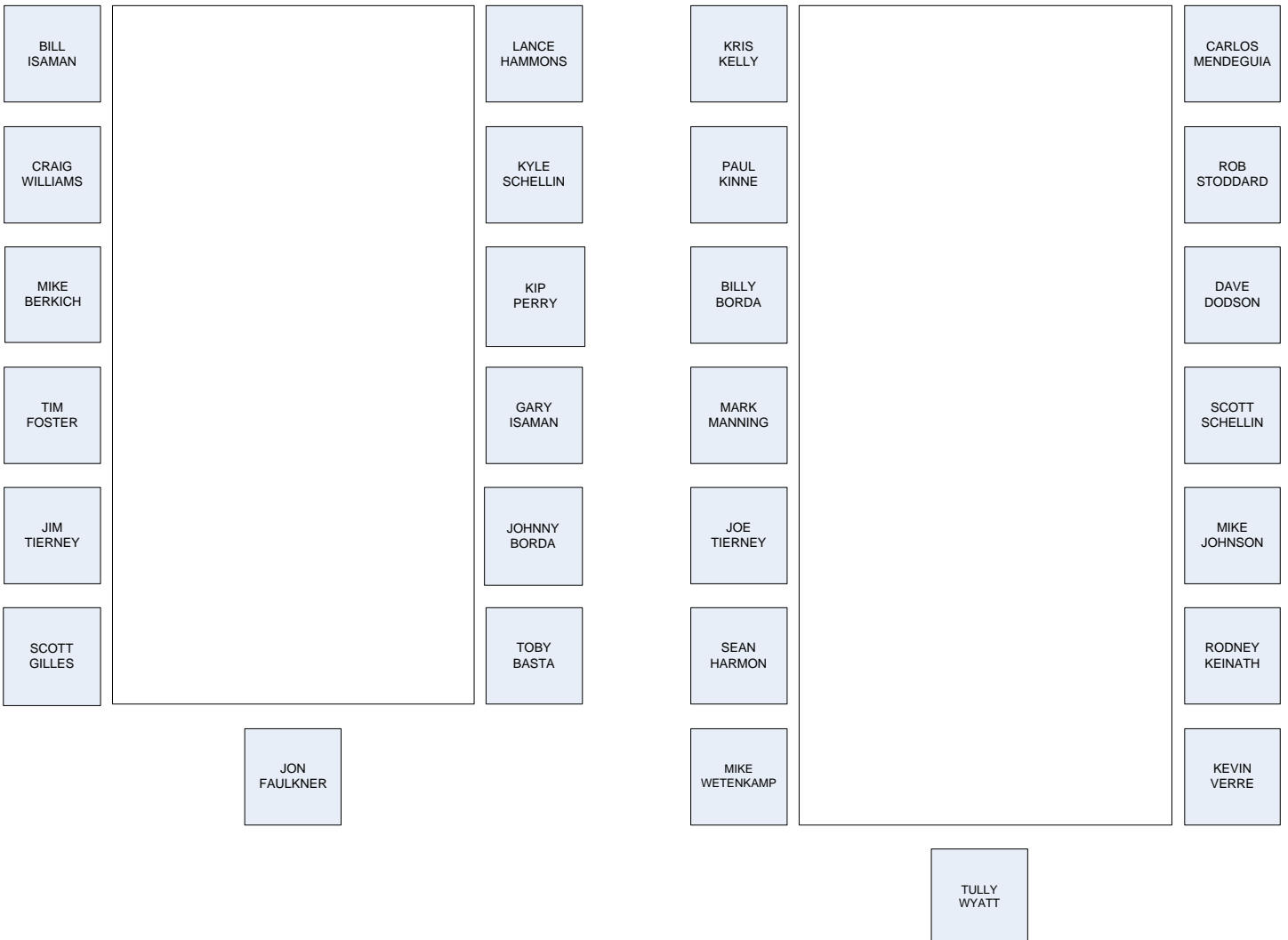
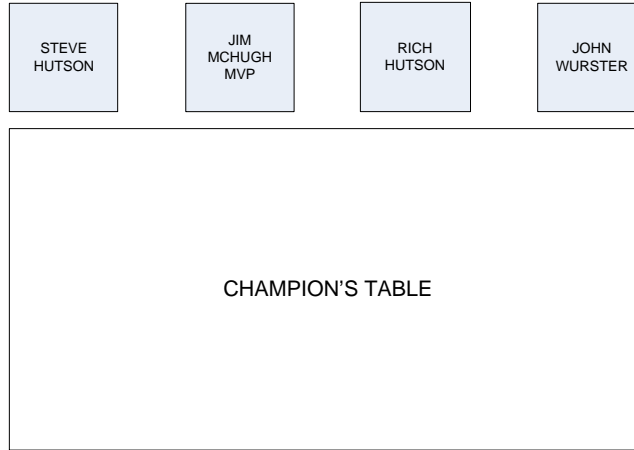

CHAMPIONSHIPS: 2 (2013, 2004)

2013 Sierra Nevada Classic – Champions (1st Horseshoes, 1st Bowling)

The date was Saturday, October 27th, 2012. The place—Carson City, NV. The smell of dew on grass, sagebrush from C-Hill and fumes from diesel engines wafted through the early morning. The parade floats lined up and down Long and Division Streets were getting some last minute touch-ups. Out of the cold morning mist, four WWII soldiers appear on Carol Tierney's front lawn—one of them holding a 12 pack of beer. The warriors each have their breakfast—a picon punch crafted on the wheel well of their ride for the next three hours. Picons consumed, the Colt .45s take the first steps onto the hill of dirt that was their reward for finishing last in the 2012 SNC. Fast forward to 2013. The .45s slog through the golf course with 7 bogeys en route to a last place finish with a tourney high 77. The Colt .45s are right where they belong, right? Wrong. Soldier boots on. Bayonets fixed. Rifles locked and loaded. First up--Penetrators in the 1st round of horseshoes. BAM! Then, Stage Fright. KA-POW!! Championship game vs. Full House. BOOM!!! Suddenly, the doormats are brushing the sands of Iwo Jima off of their brows and heading up the hill to the bowling lanes. Full House tries an ambush in the first round but gets outflanked. Then, the battle that would decide it all. Stage Fright was embedded in a fortified bunker right in their path. Whoever wins this battle, wins the war. GRENADE! Stage Fright's bunker was busted and the Colt .45s marched through the Penetrators to raise the championship flag on top of the 2013 SNC. What happened on the float that Nevada day? Only the Colt .45s will ever know but it must have been something magical. That was the first step of a very long journey that led all the way to the Promised Land. From float to first, these guys did the unthinkable—they were truly "Battle Born!"



Jim "2-4-2" McHugh – Captain (MVP – 2013)

McHugh was instrumental in his squad's success in 2013 as he had a team high 6 drives in golf, 3 ringers and 13 points in horseshoes and scores of 146, 122 and 195 in bowling to lead his team to title town. His Sargent-like leadership and never say die attitude got the attention of the league as he was voted to the 2013 MVP—his first in 13 years. Jim looks for more of the same dedication in SNC 19, because as every soldier knows—the war is never over.



Rich "All World" Huston (MVP – 2007)

All World came up huge in 2013's golf tourney with 5 drives and 5 putts and then went on to throw 9 ringers and 11 points in horseshoes including 4 ringers in the championship game! Showing no signs of picon fatigue, Huston then bowled 154, 149 and 155 at the lanes to solidify the championship. All World was recently spotted at Lake Tahoe for some well-deserved R&R before his next tour of duty where he was overheard promising the same type of fire fight for SNC 19.



John "Shortstack" Wurster

Wurster came out firing with 5 drives and 6 putts in a losing golf outing, but then this demolition expert exploded with the 4th best horseshoe average in the entire league with 12.33 points per game and 4 ringers in the championship game. John then set a couple of C-4 charges at the lanes with a 157, a 180 and a 196 in the deciding game vs. Stage Fright that blew the tourney open. Shortstack has been training hard in the off-season and will again prove that, like TNT, big things come in small packages.



Steve "Wheels" Hutson (ROY – 2009)

Steve got out of the gates a little slow in golf with the minimum number of drives used on the links, but he did chip in with 5 putts. Then came horseshoes—Wheels unleashed a fury of 10 ringers and 18 points onto his opponents like an F-8 fighter jet dropping napalm on Charlie back in 'Nam. After re-arming at lunch, Hutson went on to carpet-bomb the enemies' forward positions with scores of 150, 150 and 149 at the lanes. This off-season, Steve was rumored to be working on some new focusing techniques including LGH (Laser Guided Horseshoes) so the rest of the field better be ready for combat in 2014.

2014 Prediction: 3rd Place

Although the Colt .45s came with it in SNC 18, don't expect them to repeat in SNC 19. If they start the tourney with another last place in golf, they could be in serious trouble if they don't get to the championship rounds in one or both of the other two events. Also, with half of the team pushing the mid-century mark, fatigue will definitely be a factor. When the Commission contacted Captain 2-4-2 about the third place prediction, he was in his yacht, anchored just off of Catalina Island and he replied, "We know how to rough it and work hard. We will be back."



STAGE FRIGHT

YEARS IN LEAGUE: 17

CHAMPIONSHIPS: 0

2013 Sierra Nevada Classic – 2nd Place (1st Place Golf, 4th Place Horseshoes, 4th Place Bowling)

So close, yet so far away. This will surely be the year that Stage Fright never forgets as they had two chances to put the last place Colt .45s away while securing the trophy, but the .45s beat up on Stage Fright in horseshoes and in bowling to turn the tables on the strong favorites. After taking a 1st place in Golf, SF got a first round win in the pits to face the .45s in the semis. A win would have all but wrapped the trophy up before lunch for the first time in tourney history, but the Colt .45s had other ideas. SF would meet them again several hours later with the tourney on the line. Full House had already lost their opening round so they were now out if it. The only thing standing in Stage Fright's way was a win against the .45s in the bowling semi-finals, but again, they were denied by the scrappy underdogs who sent them home with a 2nd place finish.



Lance "Yeti" Hammons – Captain (MI – 2004)

Captain Hammons was vital in Stage Frights run in 2013 with a solid golf round of 4 drives and 4 putts, but nothing was more important than his historic chip-in on hole 17. With Let It Ride breathing down their necks, Yeti sank an eagle chip on 17 to put his squad up by 3 strokes which would be enough to hold on for the golf win. He also roared 2 ringers and 16 points on his far less hairy opponents in horseshoes and a 149 average in bowling. The Yeti spent the off-season growing hair and opponents will scatter like cotton tailed bunny rabbits when his revenge is growled in 2014.



Bill "Da Whala" Isaman (ROY – 1997)

Da Whala was solid as always on the links leading his team to the early four points in golf, but after his opening round of 3 ringers and 4 points in horseshoes, he couldn't find the peg in the semis and consolation rounds. After a long swim in the Picon Sea and over 200 plates of kelp, the whale came into the lanes spouting bowling balls out of his blow-hole en route to an impressive 152 average. However, it wasn't enough blubber this year and Da Whala hit the open ocean for his long swim back to the more friendly waters of San Luis Obispo.



Kyle "Leroy" Schellin (MI – 2003, ROY – 2001)

Leroy greased his way into the 2013 golf tourney and oozed 6 drives and 5 putts on the Genoa links to help his team grab the early points. He had 2 ringers and 7 points in the horseshoe opener, but like the rest of his team, he ran into the Colt .45 buzz-saw for the rest of the tourney. He struggled to find the pits in the rest of the horseshoe tourney and his 123 average in bowling wasn't enough to bury the new rivals. He spent the off-season having his 2nd kid in 2 months.



Craig "Lurch" Williams (ROY – 2008)

Lurch, the most underrated golfer in the tourney, continued his impressive play on the links with 5 drives and 5 putts. He then threw the shoes well with 3 ringers and 22 points but unfortunately, the majority of those were in the first round. He also bowled a nice 123 average for the day, but it was only good enough for 4th place. Later that evening, moaning, zombie-like, Lurch noises were heard in the hallways of the CVI as he roamed the hotel searching for answers to the Colt .45 curse.

2014 Prediction: 1st Place

There is no doubt about these guys getting high points in golf and they had an unusually tough draw in shoes and bowling. They have gotten closer to a championship every year and last year was no different. With the bitter taste of second place in their pie holes, these guys will be looking for a metal pallet cleanser in the form of the trophy. When the Commission contacted Captain Yeti in the offseason about the 1st place prediction, his only reply was "I sleep in drawers."

2013 Sierra Nevada Classic – 3rd Place (3rd Place Golf, 2nd Place Horseshoes)

The always colorful, never quiet, Full House uniforms came ready to hit the ball on the links in 2013, but the uniforms came without any golfers inside of them. The old saying used to go, ‘There are only 4 sure things in life—death, taxes, the Sierra Nevada Classic and a 1st place in golf for Full House. Lately, however, Stage Fright, Let It Ride and the Penetrators have been giving FH something to think about. Maybe it was the pants, but they could only muster 3 birdies on their round this year, leading them to a disappointing third place in golf. Captain Skeets must have lit a fire under his team because the next morning, they came out throwing horseshoes like darts, sweeping their first two opponents before falling in the finals. Suddenly, FH was looking like a team of old with 5 points going into lunch and these guys know how to pull a trigger. Plenty of energy reserves in tow, Kris decided to skip the whole sleep thing on Sunday and then headed straight to Reno Tahoe Airport to start the beginning of a 3 month, 12 city, European and Asian tour, with the last week being spent in the jungle with the character from the Dos Equis commercials. Stay thirsty, my friends.



Rob “Bor” Stoddard

Bor showed up as he always does for golf—red eyes, double greyhound, no warm-ups and then—300 yards right down the middle. He also brought his finesse as he dropped 6 putts on the tricky Genoa greens. He then threw 3 ringers and 13 points en route to a 2nd place in horseshoes before he dug his tusks into a plate of food and a pile of picons. Maybe he liked the food, drinks and chit chat or maybe he was just happy to be out of his golf pants, but Bor came out of the JT with a huge smile, loose, and ready to bowl. He might have been a little too loose, however, as he rolled a 112—almost 30 pins off of his all-time average. As he went into the night, he was heard muttering something about having to go back to doing B Cubed’s books.



Paul “Packsand” Kinne (MVP – 2009, MI – 2006)

Packsand strutted onto the links with his fancy golf pants looking like he was born in them and he must have felt like it as well since he put 4 drives and 4 putts out into the Genoa air. You know Packsand is going to be tough when there is any sand in a game and he proved it again with 3 ringers and 19 points in horseshoes. Bowling is usually not this guy’s best sport and you can often hear Kinne refer to it as a “carnival game” but he rolled a very respectable 137 in his first and only round. The tourney was over just in time for Paul as he had to head up to Donner Lake to perform a parasailing demonstration.



Carlos “The Apostle” Mendeguia

Golf is not usually The Apostle’s best sport of the tourney, but he had a very nice day on the greens sinking 6 putts while very natural in his “Loud Mouth” attire. Then, more of the same in horseshoes where he dominated with 4 ringers and 18 points and a 2nd place finish. Lunch is always a piece of cake for this Basque-O, and like his Basque brother Packsand, he showed that picons have little effect on their mindset as he threw a 145 in his only game. Then it was back to running errands for his dad’s restaurant, so he hopped on his 1981 Honda Moped and rode from the CVI to Carson City at 23 miles per hour.

2014 Prediction: 2nd Place

There is no way that Full House goes three straight years without winning golf and that puts them in good shape going into horseshoes. If they can duplicate their horseshoe efforts like last year, they might not even have to bowl to win, but it is more likely that they finish 3rd or 4th in shoes and then grab a point or two in bowling which gives them 6 - 7 points and a second place finish. Captain Skeets was reached for comment in the off-season while in Vietnam and the only thing he said was “Ditty Mao” which is Vietnamese for “Back to work.”



PENETRATORS

YEARS IN LEAGUE: 18

CHAMPIONSHIPS: 5 (2012, 2011, 2008, 1998, 1996)

2013 Sierra Nevada Classic – 4th Place (2nd Place Bowling)

For SNC 18, the Penetrators were trying to become only the second team in history to three peat, but as the first tee time beckoned, Captain Greez seemed more concerned about his team's drink orders than teeing off. This would set the tone as the Penetrators would never find their groove on the golf course as they combined for 2 double bogeys, 1 bogey and 3 birdies to finish tied for 6th place. But the Penetrators were not fazed since the last two championships were won with no points needed on the links. When the morning dawned Saturday on the horseshoe pits however, the Penetrators came face to face with perennial favorites Colt .45s. Both A and B squads battled, but the Penetrators lost in the tiebreaker and headed into lunch with zero points. With no way to win another championship, The Penetrators headed to bowling to play spoiler. They would go on to crush Let It Ride and From The Brickyard before meeting their match and losing handily to eventual champion Colt .45s to settle for an overall 4th place finish, their worst finish in the new four member team era.



Kip “Greez” Perry – Captain (MVP – 2012, 2008, 1998)

Captain Greez slid into SNC 18 with seventeen years and three MVPs under his belt ready to apply some Rogaine to the field for a record 6th Championship. Things got off to a rough start as he was only able to contribute 2 drives and 4 putts on the course as his team finished at the back end for a 6th place finish. Even with this setback, Greez knew a decent run in horseshoes would pave the way to a title. Against the favorite Colt .45s, Kip tossed a very respectable 6 ringers and 10 ten points but lost a heartbreaker in the tiebreaker round to leave the pits without a point. With no chance for the three peat, the Captain was out of oil as he finished the day with a 123 average, 22 pins shy of his norm, and history would have to wait for another day to repeat itself.



Mike “Paw” Berkich (MVP – 2006)

Former MVP and Captain Paw looked very confident as he shuffled up to the tee box for his thirteenth Classic. Not drafted for his golfing prowess, Paw coolly drove the fairway 5 times and sank 3 putts as he tried to will his team to points in golf. Down but not out, Paw and A squad teammate Flame clawed and scratched in the horseshoe pit as Paw tossed 2 ringers and 1 point in a narrow loss to the heavily favored Hutson Brothers. After lunch and some mumbling about no title chance, Paw laced up the bowling shoes but could only muster a 125 average which was well off his normal pace as he packed up his bowling ball and headed for the lounge.



Tim “The Flame” Foster (MVP – 2011)

Besides the early days of the “White Russian” seven distant years ago, Flame has been one of the more consistent athletes in the Classic and SNC 18 was no exception, as like his namesake he came into this year's tournament on fire torching Genoa Lakes for an amazing 9 drives and 9 putts, but it still wasn't enough to propel his team to points. The next morning, even with a slight Nevada chill and some fierce winds, Flame was still burning as he threw 2 ringers and 2 points in a tough defeat at the hands of the Hutson Brothers. After an effortless lunch and now playing only for pride, Flame could still not be extinguished as he remained true to form on the lanes with a solid 191 average day and a second place finish in bowling.



Gary “Bacon” Isaman

After two full seasons in the Classic it looked like Bacon was ready to sizzle and leave some grease on the opposition. However, we are not sure if he got the memo from the Commission. As expected he fulfilled his quota on the links by contributing the required 2 drives and also 2 putts, but the horseshoe pits were a different story. In a first round win against Colt .45s he contributed 4 points but in the tiebreaker, he was shut out as he and Greez limped away without a point. He did gather himself at lunch and eased onto the lanes where he bowled an above average 113.5 for the day but there was not enough fat to produce any drippings for another championship trophy.

2014 Prediction: 4th Place

The Penetrators are beginning to look like a one trick pony. Of course, they are still virtually untouchable on the lanes but each year the golf course and horseshoe pits become more and more of a challenge for them to get points. They will still be in the mix this year, but I think they may have fallen back to the pack. Asked for comment on his team's prediction, Captain Greez responded, “Last year was a fluke, we are ready to start another string of titles!”

CHAMPIONSHIPS: 2 (2005, 2003)

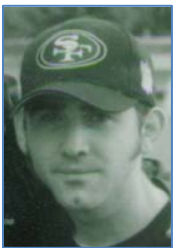
2013 Sierra Nevada Classic – 5th Place (4th Golf, 3rd Horseshoes)

Without the threat of riding on a Nevada Day Float, Fistful were calm, cool and collected going into SNC 18. They day started off splendidly as they birdied the first two holes and continued with inspired golfing throughout the day. Going into the 17th hole they were tied with Full House for 3rd place, but back to back bogeys dropped them into a tie for 4th place forcing a playoff with the Point Shavers. After two more playoff holes, Fistful finally got the win and headed back to the CVI with a well-earned point. Spirits where high as they unloaded from the hotel shuttle to the horseshoe pits, the only problem was they were matched with the reigning horseshoe champions From The Brickyard and were big underdogs. Reaching down deep, Fistful's A squad inched on to face FTB's B squad where they won in controversial fashion 21 – 18. They battled Full House in the semifinals, but couldn't get over the hump as they moved to the consolation round where the A squad got past Stage Fright to take a 3rd place finish in horseshoes, their highest finish to date. With three points leaving the JT, Fistful was walking on sunshine to the bowling alley, then BAM! Like the majority of past Classics, they couldn't stay consistent on the lanes and got crushed by Stage Fright to the tune of 57 pins to finish in 5th place overall.



Billy "Dot" Borda – Captain (MVP – 2003)

Coming into SNC 18, Captain Dot seemed ready to step out of her shadow and lead Fistful to the promised land. Not known for her power from the tee box, Dot only contributed 3 drives, but used her finesse game to lead the team with 7 putts. Moving to the horseshoe pits, Dot was locked and loaded as she tossed 4 ringers and 11 points in a tiebreaker win over From The Brickyard and continued to blister the peg ending the day with 11 ringers and 28 points for a 12.20 per game average to help secure a 3rd place finish. On to bowling where she is hit or miss, Dot rolled a team leading 159, 27 pins higher than her average, but it wasn't enough as Fistful exited the first round.



Dave "The Stormin' X-Mormon" Dodson

The Stormin' X-Mormon had spent the off season working on his core so he could again carry Fistful on his back on Genoa Lakes as the team rode him for 10 drives and 3 putts for a 4th place finish. Horseshoes, not so good, as the X-Mormon could muster only 1 ringer and 7 points in three B squad losses. With horseshoes behind him and a nice lunch and picnics swirling around his mid-section, X-Mormon was eager to hit the lanes where he has been steadily improving every year. But this was not the season for betterment as he couldn't break the century mark to finish his 18th Classic with a 99, and joined his Captain for some coolies in the bar.



Mark "Ziggy" Manning

The etching however would not begin on the golf course as only 3 drives and 3 putts where used. And he didn't stop there as would finish with 6 ringers and 25 points for the day to help Fistful to their best ever 3rd place finish in shoes. After yet another inspiring effort at the JT, Ziggy wanted some bowling pins for dessert, but, alas, he had had his fill as he struggled to a 111, 21 pins below his average. With that, whiskey would be next on the menu.



Scott "The Leprechaun" Schellin (MI – 2002)

Prior to SNC 18, The Leprechaun was overheard saying that he was planning to make this Classic, "magically delicious!" However, the tee boxes at Genoa Lakes weren't so tasty as he was only able to contribute the required 2 drives but he did come up big with 5 putts to enhance the day's flavor profile. The horseshoe pits on the other hand would be inedible as Leps would only toss 2 ringers and 7 points in three straight losses with his B squad. Lunch would prove savory for the Leprechaun and after a couple "self" pep talks he was ready to bowl. Yummy! He would score 19 pins more than his average with a 127, but his team was out and he would stagger to the lounge murmuring, "Who stole me lucky charms?"

2014 Prediction: 6th Place

It might be a long shot for Fistful Of \$\$\$\$ to ever crack the top 4, forget about a title. As the golf teams begin to get better their chances become slimmer. They have been getting points in horseshoes using smoke and mirrors and they don't scare anybody on the lanes. 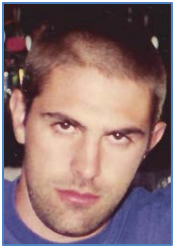
LET IT RIDE

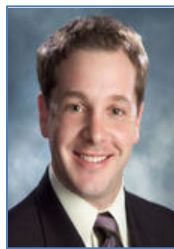
Jim "Chilinch" Tierney (MVP – 2004)

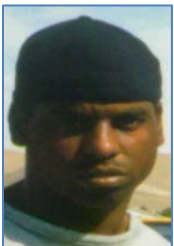
Joe "Casanova" Tierney – Captain (MVP – 2005, ROY – 2000)

Mike "Sleepy" Johnson (ROY – 2002)

Not usually counted on for his golf game, Sleepy came out of his shoes to lead his team with 8 drives on the links to go with an impressive 6 putts. He tired a little in the horseshoe pits as he went into a defensive mode and was only able to contribute 4 points to his B squad, but yet they were still only a ringer away from advancing. After another dominating performance at the JT and a quick cat nap, he was back to help FTB to a 3rd place finish in bowling as he ended well above his Classic average with a 142 for the day.

2014 Prediction: 5th Place

Obviously this will be a very difficult year for this team without the heart and soul of their Captain Silk. In the off-season all members of From The Brickyard petitioned the Commission to forever change their team name to Powell's Brickyard in lasting memory of their fallen Captain. This decision was ratified without hesitation. Look for Powell's Brickyard to compete on different level in this year's Classic with more bounces and throws going their way. That would not happen this year as Goose seemed lost without his normal pitching partner and was only able to muster 3 points in his A squad loss and 2 ringers and 6 points in the B squad loss. Lunch at JTs was handled without issue and he didn’t go down without a fight as he bowled well above his average to lead the Shavers with a 135.



Kevin “Special K” Verre

Special K dropped his new album on SNC 18 to great anticipation, but there was a great disparity of song quality from Side 1 to Side 2. On Side 1 he was again very consistent on the links as the Shavers used 7 of his drives and 6 of his putts. However, when the album was flipped over to Side 2, the songs began to go awry. In horseshoes, he was only able to string together 1 ringer and 3 points in his B squad loss. Next, something epic must have taken place at lunch because as Side 2 spun to an end, Special K had somehow managed to bowl a 59. With that there wasn’t much left to do but cancel his upcoming tour and headline the Silver Strike Lounge.

Hoping to provide some much needed discipline and stability, the Point Shavers signed Tully “The Colonel” Wyatt out of Camp San Luis Obispo to an undisclosed amount.
