For the first time in tournament history the home of the Classic Weekend will not be hosted at the Carson Station Hotel and Casino in Carson City, Nevada. The memories gained over fifteen years at the Station will live on forever in each and every SNC Athlete's mind, but with the departure of the tournament from Carson City, the SNC eagerly awaits the new venue in Sparks, at John Ascuaga's Nugget, and looks forward to several more years of memories to be made. SNC Golf Scramble Rules

Method of play and rules:

- 1. Play begins with each member of the group teeing off.
- 2. With the agreement of the other members of the group, the team captain decides which drive is the most desirable.
- 3. The other members of the group pick up their balls and proceed to the spot of the selected drive, where they will hit their second (or third, or fourth, etc. shot).
- 4. After the shot, all balls may be placed within one club length of the original ball. This may be done either to the side or backwards. Balls may not be placed closer to the hole.
- 5. In placing the ball, you may not change the condition of the shot. If the ball is in a hazard (e.g. sand trap, rough) all members of the team must play their shot from the trap or rough, respectively.
- 6. This procedure continues until the ball is in the hole.
- 7. On the putting green, **do not hole out a short putt if you have missed your first putt.** The first ball putted must count. Mark your ball and wait. If the second or third putt is better mark that putt. Under no circumstances will there be any gimmies.
- 8. At the end of each hole, the score for the group is recorded on the card.
- 9. All scorecards must be kept accurately and per hole.
- 10. Each player on the team must contribute at least **two** tee shots per 18 holes. When recording your score on the card, you must input which player's tee shot was used on every hole. Also mark down which member of your team made the putt.
- 11. The maximum score allowed is a double-par. After that, simply pick up the balls and move on to the next hole.



SNC Horseshoe Tournament Rules

Method of play and rules:

- 1. All court layout dimensions, playing equipment and scoring will follow the official rules sanctioned by the NHPA (National Horseshoe Pitchers Association of America).
- 2. Cancellation scoring will be used to keep score during the tournament.
- 3. Ringer: Ringers cancel each other. A ringer of one contestant shall cancel a ringer of another contestant and those shoes shall not score any points. Any uncancelled (live) ringers shall score 3 points.
- 4. Shoes in Count: A shoe in count (upright horseshoe length from the stake) shall score one point under the following conditions: If there are cancelled ringers and no live ringer, the closest shoe in count to the stake shall score one point. If there are no ringers, the closest shoe in count to the stake shall score one point. If the other shoe of the same contestant is the second closest shoe in count, it shall also score one point. If there is one uncancelled ringer and the other shoe of the scoring contestant is the closest shoe in count to the stake, it shall score one point (four points total).
- 5. On tournament day, there will be one scorekeeper per game. This score sheet shall be the official record of the game. Contestants are encouraged to pay close attention to the score at all times. If a question or discrepancy occurs regarding the score, the contestant(s) may approach the scorekeeper between innings to rectify the situation. This scorekeeper or other identified authority will also judge any discrepancy of which contestants shoes are closer to the stakes during the game. If discrepancies cannot be corrected to the satisfaction of all contestants, the tournament judge shall be called in to make the final decision.
- 6. Each team will be comprised of four pitchers. Each team will be selected into an eight team bracket that will be drawn at the Genoa Room in John Ascuaga's Nugget on seeding night.
- 7. The Horseshoe Tournament will begin with your team dividing into two teams of two contestants. (**These teams must be determined before seeding**). Your two teams will be matched against the other team in your bracket who will also divide their team into two teams of two contestants.
- 8. **RULE CHANGE:** Please note, that your "A" squad will match up with your opponents "A" squad along with "B" squad vs. "B" squad in your individual bracket. If both of your split squads win, you advance out of bracket. If one squad loses and the other wins, only the winning squad can participate in the tie breaker to advance to the next round. Also, the bottom team in the bracket will call the coin toss and be able to choose individual match ups within the bracket. There will again be a coin flip in case of a tie breaker.
- 9. Each game will be played to twenty-one points. However, the skunk rule will be in effect. If any team scores eleven points before their opponent scores one point, the game is over. Final score would be (11-0).
- 10. The Sierra Nevada Athletic Commission will allow alcohol, smoking and chewing during this tournament event.



SNC Bowling Tournament Rules

Method of play and rules:

- 1. Teams will begin round one play based on Thursday night bracket seeding.
- 2. The teams that win in the first round will advance to the second round and either the title or consolation games via match play.

Overall Tournament Scoring Rules

1st Place In An Individual Event	4 Points
2 nd Place In An Individual Event	3 Points
3 rd Place In An Individual Event	2 Points
4 th Place In An Individual Event	1 Point

Tiebreaker

If the day ends with a tie for first place in the overall tournament, a bowl-off will be implemented to determine the champion. Then, in order to determine the overall finish other than first, total points and then total bowling average will be used to rank teams.





Jon "Bucky The Wonder Horse" Faulkner

Supervising SNC Cameraman Jon Faulkner will again let the camera roll to capture the action in the tournament for his fifth year at the helm. Faulkner, has the experience and SNC Hardware (2006 Rookie of the Year) to carry on his shoulder during tournament weekend as he continues to compile a video vault that will be enjoyed for generations to come. His crowning moment will be when the SNC Documentary premiers in October of 2012. During the offseason at a weekend SNC Filming, Faulkner had a rather welcome stumble off of the wagon at the Nugget in Sparks, and has yet to gain enough momentum to climb back on. Although Faulkner holds the honor of being the oldest member of the SNC (49), he continues to cruise through the SNC Weekend with the ease and excitement of a twenty year old.



FULL HOUSE

YEARS IN LEAGUE: 9

Championships: 3 (2007, 2009, 2010)

2010 Sierra Nevada Classic – Champions (1st Place Golf, 1st Place Bowling)

Full House showed up for golf in fine fashion with day-glo orange body suites that fit each member like a glove and for the second straight year, as predicted by odds makers, Full House started Saturday with 4 points with another first place in golf. However, unlike last year's tough battle on the course, Full House demolished the rest of the teams and ended up winning by 4 strokes with a round of 62 that may go down in SNC History with eight birdies, one eagle and no bogies. After riding high Friday Night with their outstanding performance in golf, the champs hit a bit of a snag in the horseshoe pits when they were rudely ousted out of the horseshoe tourney by From the Brickyard in two matches losing 21-7 and 21-11. But they headed to lunch with two Bascos, one big guy and one Irishman and took the bull by the horns. After the meat and picons settled, Full House walked into the Carson Lanes like Reservoir Dogs and similar to golf, dominated the last event of the day and re-hoisted the new SNC Cup and celebrated their back to back titles. It was well deserved as they out bowled the best bowling team, The Penetrators, by 37 pins in the championship matchup.



Kris "Skeets" Kelly - Captain (MVP - 2010)

After thirteen years in the Sierra Nevada Classic this longtime captain can finally hoist some individual hardware. There wasn't much Skeets didn't do for his squad in SNC 15. He again had Full House in the position on nearly every shot to make birdie or par, but what he did at the Carson lanes will go down in SNC History. His three game average of 168 was a major factor in helping Full House secure the title and when his team really needed him in the final game with The Penetrators, he locked in and bowled a 188 and his team was crowned champion for the second straight year in the new era of the SNC.



Rob "Bor" Stoddard

No surprises from this kid as Bor did what he does best and dominated on the golf course. He consistently hit great tee shots on the links and when he had the chance to sink a putt, money. Bor and his captain Skeets gave their team that 1-2 punch that keeps them head and shoulders above the rest of the pack. Full House used six of Bor's drives, more than any other team member. Like the rest of his squad he would like to forget last year's horseshoe tourney, but he again dominated at lunch and just after finishing his fifth picon, slid right into the first of many screwdrivers for the evening. Bor was as impressive as his captain in bowling with a three game average at the Carson Lanes of 162.



Paul "Packsand" Kinne (MVP 2009, Most Inspirational 2006)

Kinne again was an important key in getting his team going on the early holes in golf and was instrumental in keeping the team's spirits up as they struggled a bit through the first 5 holes. He did what he could in horseshoes, but it wasn't enough in his team's one and done in the pits. Maybe Packsand's arms were tired from carrying the SNC Cup around the JT or maybe it was too many sips from the trophy, whatever it was, the half time stop proved the undoing of the SNC 14 MVP as his three bowling scores after lunch were 99, 102 and 93, ouch! Look for Kinne to be more closely monitored by his captain this year at lunch.



Carlos "The Apostle" Mendeguia

The Apostle must have slept with his putter the night before the golf tournament last year because other than a few missed puts on tourney day, Mendeguia sank nearly everything lined up. His three teammates could have made it through the round without even taking out their putters the way The Apostle dominated on the greens by sinking nine out of the eighteen putts for his team. Like his teammates, horseshoes will be a work in progress. Over the last three years, nobody in the league has improved like this kid. His three game average of 132, was the key ingredient to take his team over the top in bowling and secure his second tournament win.

2011 Prediction: 1st Place

Plan on Full House holding this spot for years to come. With a golf game second to none, they are going to be near the top spot every year. Even though they have struggled in horseshoes the last two years, they know how to close out the tournament on the lanes with a stellar bowling squad.



PENETRATORS

YEARS IN LEAGUE: 15

CHAMPIONSHIPS: 3 (1996, 1998, 2008)

2010 Sierra Nevada Classic – 2nd Place (4th Golf, 2nd Horseshoes, 2nd Bowling)

Penetrators had an impressive tournament as they were the only team to place in all three events, but it was another year, another second place finish. They started off hot in golf and looked to be in a good position for a 2nd place finish, but a bogey on 12 knocked them back two strokes and they would never recover. Still with five birdies and the rest par golf, this squad locked up a 4th place. Entering Saturday morning with 1 point, they went to work in the horseshoe pits. Although there "A" team of Perry/Foster lost their opening round matchup to the Point Shavers, their "B" team of Berkich/Franz cruised through their first game with a 21-3 thrashing. With a second wind, the Penetrators dug deep in the playoff and took it to the Shavers to advance with a 21-16 victory. Both of their squads cruised by Let It Ride in the semifinals, but they ran out of steam as they suffered a two squad loss to the heavily favored Colt .45s in the championship. With 3 points and their best event in front of them, the Penetrators had to like their chances for a title as they headed to lunch tied with Full House and The Colt .45s. After a solid half time, they strutted into the Carson Lanes and plowed through the Point Shavers by 124 pins. They faced the Colt .45s in the semifinals and paid them back for the horseshoe loss winning by 50 pins to set up the championship matchup with Full House for the SNC 15 Title. They battled neck and neck, but they couldn't knock down the key pins as they took the loss by 37 pins and went into the offseason with a bitter taste left in their mouths.



Kip "Greez" Perry – Captain (MVP – 1998, 2008)

As always Captain Greez played consistent on the course and several of his tee shots and putts were used throughout the round. Next day it was on to the pits and although it took him one game to get some momentum, Greez was then locked in as he led his team to the finals before falling a bit short. After lunch he started off on fire in the lanes with a first round of 180, followed by a 154 in the semis to help move his team to the finals. But it may have been the long weekend or maybe the picons that finally caught up with him in the championships as his score plummeted to a 109 to return to the drawing board to try and remove the second place jinx.



Mike "Paw" Berkich (MVP - 2006)

Paw, not known for his golf game, got his team the required two tee shots and banged home a few putts, but his offseason work in the pits was more than evident as he carried the "B" Squad all the way to the finals with the same accuracy as his lethal game of "bags", where he is known in circles of Chicago to be a professional. He pitched several ringers and added key points throughout the tournament. After lunch he gave his captain a pep talk that went something like, "Ahhh, Pair, gurginn nuffun nlezzz goin uhn go gitit,har meggin' Pentrators!" He again dominated on the lanes with a three game average of 156 and did everything he could with a championship round of 160.



Tim "The Flame" Foster

Just like last year, the Flame was a force on the links with his lethal drives of both length and accuracy. Nine tee shots were used by Foster to help secure the Penetrator's fourth place finish at Carson Valley. In horseshoes, he made it a point to score early and often for his team and the 1-2 punch of his captain Perry and himself nearly pulled off the upset of eventual champs, the Colt .45s. After another year of 5 confirmed picons at the JT, The Flame returned to his home away from home, the Carson Lanes. He started off strong with a 182, but he couldn't find the pocket the rest of the way as he bowled a 149 in the semifinals and a 167 in the championship.



Matt "The Rock" Franz (ROY – 2005)

Golf will probably never be the funniest part of The Rock's weekend, but he gathered some tips over the offseason to help keep the ball on the fairway, his pitches lofty and his putts true. On Saturday Morning, he went to work early with key ringers and plenty of points and along with Berkich handled all of the competition in their path as they would not lose until the final matchup. After lunch, he tried to put on a happy face at the Carson Lanes, but his three game average of 102 was a low point for his weekend.

2011 Prediction: 2nd Place

Look for them to again get some points in golf, not sure if they can pull off another second place finish in the pits, but their bowling squad will be in the finals pretty much every year. A first place finish is just around the corner for these boys.



COLT .45s

YEARS IN LEAUGE: 11 CHAMPIONSHIPS: 1 (2004)

2010 Sierra Nevada Classic – 3rd Place (1st Place Horseshoes, 3rd Place Bowling)

It was déjà vu all over again in SNC 15 as The Colt .45s took a 1st place in horseshoes, a 3rd place in bowling and a 3rd place overall in the tournament. Despite donning the most offensive snot colored golf shirts, the Colt .45s started off hot with a birdie, the only team to accomplish this task. However, the rest of their day was filled with pars, two bogies and only one more birdie, landing them in sixth place on the course. They arrived confident at the horseshoe pits after their first place finish in the event in SNC 14 and they didn't disappoint taking another 1st place. But there were some close calls. In the first round against Fistful of \$\$\$, they needed a playoff to advance and in the semifinals against From The Brickyard, they were down 17-19 before All World tossed a six pack to escape with a 23-19 victory. Once in the finals, they edged the Penetrators 21-15 and 21-16 and headed to lunch tied for first with a great shot at the title. After a power lunch and several drinks some team members swerved into the bowling alley. They were able to make easy work out of Fistful in the first round despite some under average scores, but would not be so lucky in the semifinals as they lost to the Penetrators by 50 pins and lost their shot at the title. Colt .45s regained their composure in the consolation round taking care of Stage Fright by 62 pins, but it was too little, too late.



Jim "2-4-2" McHugh – Captain

The Captain of all Captains returns to lead this team to title in the new era. 242 was steady on the course as The Colt .45s used six of his drives and four of his putts during the round at Carson Valley. Looking to build on last season's success in horseshoes, he made a wise decision and moved himself to the B squad in horseshoes and despite the opening round loss to team Dodson/Manning, it was smooth sailing in the next two matches to help claim a second title. As always, after his favorite drink of picons, McHugh stepped into his comfort zone and started the day with an impressive first round 190. He went then went on to bowl 147 in the semifinals and 143 in the consolation victory.



Rich "All World" Huston (MVP -2007)

Still the only player in the tournament that doesn't use woods in the tee box, All World golfed an average round as only five of his drives were used along with three of his putts. Although upset to finish out of points in golf, he was looking forward to hearing the constant clink and clank in the pits. The Hutson brothers proved SNC 14 was no fluke as they again went through the bracket undefeated, and his six pack game winner in the semis was a thing of beauty. With the success in horseshoes and being tied for first going into lunch, the hype, wine or picons may have gotten the best of All World, as his shadow went on to bowl an 88 in the first round. His teammates were able to pick him up and advance, but they couldn't compensate for his 117 in the semifinals as they headed to the consolation bracket.



John "Shortstack" Wurster

Everyone gets comfortable when Shortstack steps to the ball and goes through his "time honored" routine. According to Shortstack, you just can't rush excellence, and the Colt .45s used the most of his drives (six) and four of his putts. The pace doesn't pick up much in shoes but he teamed well with his captain on the B squad and tossed several ringers and secured a ton of points to help his team repeat as horseshoe champs. Lunch is always a phenomenon as he somehow keeps up with drinkers twice his size, yet despite his stamina and confidence, Shortstack's bowling game left something to be desired as his three game average of 114 was his lowest in tournament history.



Steve "Wheels" Hutson (ROY -2009)

There was no sophomore jinx for Wheels as he again carried himself like a seasoned veteran. Even though his team only used the required two drives, he made up for it on the greens sinking five putts. He wasn't his dominate self in horseshoes as he struggled in the semifinals with only 2 points, but he came back in the finals to help secure the repeat. Lunch is a walk in the park for this second timer and he has formally petitioned the Commission to raise the picon limit to seven. The bowling alley was another haven for Wheels as he averaged 140 over three games to do his part in the push for a title.

2010 Prediction: 3rd Place

For the third straight year, the Colt .45s will again be in position to win it all. If they can get over the hump in bowling, it's theirs for the taking.



STAGE FRIGHT

YEARS IN LEAGUE: 14 CHAMPIONSHIPS: 0

2010 Sierra Nevada Classic – 4th Place (2nd Place Golf, 4th Place Bowling)

This team made major strides during SNC 15 where they moved up from 7th to 4th place. They got off to a great start at Carson Valley which continued throughout the day with seven birdies, only one bogey and the rest pars. With the pressure on for the 18th, they needed a birdie to tie Let It Ride for second place and they nailed it to force a playoff. They battled for three playoff holes with Let It Ride before Whala sunk a bender and Stage Fright strutted off the green with three hard fought points. The bubble burst in horseshoes as Stage Fright lost their swagger and got swept by Let It Ride. It was a tremendous disappointment as they failed to advance out of the first round in shoes for the second straight year. Still confident after a grade "A" lunch, Stage Fright hit the lanes having a good chance to win the title. They started off strong with a first round victory against From The Brickyard and were well on their way to claiming the first title in team history. But the story ended in the semifinals where they ran into Full House and were smoked by 90 pins to bow out to the consolation bracket where they would again take another 4th place on the lanes.



Lance "Yeti" Hammons – Captain (MI -2004)

The hairy captain is back to lead his squad for the 14th year in the tournament. With his limited golf arsenal, Yeti did all he could to compliment a team of above average golfers. Stage Fright used three of his drives and six of his putts, which for Yeti, is like winning the US Open. His horseshoe tournament went the complete opposite direction where being part of this team's A squad they only managed to scored 6 points and were eliminated. Despite the setback in the pits, he gathered Stage Fright together for a group hug at lunch. He did his part in the opening round with a 145 score to advance to the semifinals where he again proved his worth with a 132. But it wasn't enough as finished his day with a lowly 110 and head back to his cave.



Bill "Da Whala" Isaman (ROY-1997)

For Da Whala, golf at Carson Valley was very consistent as five of his tee shots and five of his putts where used, but he saved the best for last during the 3rd playoff hole for second place where he drained a 20 foot putt that secured 3 solid points to start the tourney. Any confidence gained the previous day was quickly shattered at 9:00am Saturday Morning where he only contributed 2 points in the pits and exited early to have a full blown conversation with his shoes. After lunch, with steam and picons coming out of his ears Isaman showed why he is the team ace and dominated with a 186 opening round to help advance his team to the semifinals. Then his friends, the shoes, came back into play as he bowled a lowly 101 and his team dropped out of the hunt for a chance at the title.



Kyle "Leroy" Schellin (ROY - 2001, MI - 2003)

Leroy's tournament got off to a great start at Carson Valley where Stage Fright used six of his tee shots and three of his putts. He was also a key factor in the playoff round to help secure a second place. His performance in horseshoes along with his B Squad partner Williams was the only bright spot for Stage Fright, where they barely lost in a tough 20-21 battle against Let It Ride. Lunch at the JT is a non-factor for this veteran as he chugs O'Douls and listens to the volume rise from polite conversation to a full roar of F Bombs. It looked like the Carson Lanes would again be his nemesis as he opened round one with a 114, but he led his team with in the semifinals with an impressive 143 and

then followed with a consolation round of 132. If this keeps up, Stage Fright may be looking at their first title in team history.



Craig "Lurch" Williams (ROY - 2008)

Lurch again proved he means business on the golf course as they used four of his drives, four of his putts and some clutch shots in the playoff round. Like his teammate Schellin he held his own in the pits by notching several ringers and points during the round to give them a fighting chance. Halftime at the JT is never a problem, but a solution for this guy as he treats lunch like an event and celebrates with food and drink. Lurch looked tough in the Carson Lanes as he started off with a 135, but he was unable to build on that as he took a 118 in the semifinals, and eventually game down to earth with a 101 in his final game.

2011 Prediction: 4th Place

Look for Stage Fright to again be no lower than second place on the course. If they can iron out their problems on the pits and step up their bowling game a hair, there is no way they can't claim their first title.



LET IT RIDE

YEAR IN LEAGUE: 13 CHAMPIONSHIPS: 0

2010 Sierra Nevada Classic – 5th Place (3rd Place Golf, 4th Place Horseshoes)

Tired of an offseason of taking grief for a last place finish in SNC 14, Let It Ride came out swinging and after 14 holes with 5 birdies and 9 pars, they were still in the hunt for first place before eventually landing in a tie for 2nd place after 18. They gutted out three tough playoff holes before succumbing to Stage Fright, but ended up with two points which was a marked improvement from last season. They continued their charge early Saturday with a first round victory over favored Stage Fright in the horseshoe pits, but in the semifinals they seemed to have run out of breath against the Penetrators possibly due to the squeeze their shorts were applying. They eventually lost both matches in the semifinals and moved to the consolation bracket where they took a 4th place after a come from behind victory by From The Brickyard. Despite the 4th place, they now totaled 3 impressive points and still had a shot at the title. After another solid year at lunch, Let It Ride moved to the bowling alley which has been a sore spot for them in years past. But like all other events, they made a strong push to again gather points and end the day with the trophy. They gave it all they add in the first round against eventual champs Full House, but came up just 19 pins shy to end their day with a 5th place finish in SNC 16.



Johnny "The JB" Borda - Captain

Not known for his golfing prowess, The JB's day started when he whiffed on the first tee and had to sheepishly pick his ball up and place back in his pocket. Other than that, he performed admirably at Carson Valley getting his required two drives and leading his team on the greens with nine putts. When he entered the horseshoe pits, his movement was limited as he sported a muffin top due to some tight shorts. Despite the restriction, his B squad took a narrow victory over Stage Fright with a 21-20 win, but they couldn't squeeze out another victory in the semis or the consolation round. During lunch The JB told his team to concentrate on getting blasted and having fun, which they did, but even though he came through with a first round of 134, it wasn't enough to help advance his team.



Jim "Chilinch" Tierney (MVP - 2004)

Tierney had a fabulous day at Carson Valley and after the round was over, his captain considered petitioning the Commission for a nickname change from "Chilinch" to "Clinique", which is Basque for clinic, which is what he put on as his team used nine of his tee shots and seven of his putts. He mirrored his captain's attire in horseshoes sporting a fashion forward "skinny-short" and with his A squad teammate, made quick work of Stage Fright in the first round by knocking them out with a 21- 6 victory. Just like the rest of his Let It Ride teammates and the horseshoe fashion show, Gorko looked to be wearing a shorts size purchased at Gap Kids. He was a major reason his B Squad upset the heavily favored Stage Fright by throwing several ringers, but he struggled in the semifinal and consolation round loses which may have been attributed to the thigh highs. There is no telling how he got those off. After another dominating lunch he entered Carson Lanes with guns blazing bowling a first round 141, his tournament best.

2011 Prediction: 5th Place

They will again be in the hunt early with their outstanding golf play. The next two events for this team can either make or break them. If they can finish the day strong, the sky is the limit.



FROM THE BRICKYARD

YEARS IN LEAGUE: 12 CHAMPIONSHIPS: 0

2010 Sierra Nevada Classic – 6th Place (3rd Place Horseshoes)

Just as in SNC 14, From the Brickyard was missing another player but with the new rule change they had to compete with only a three man team. Even so, they took the same exact place in the overall tournament and placed third in the same exact event, horseshoes. Southie, who missed last year with the birth of his second child, will be eager to get back into the mix with his squad during SNC 16. He won't be their savior on the golf course, but maybe just having another chance of someone on his team hitting the ball in the fairway will be somewhat of a help. As evidenced in SNC 14 he should pay huge dividends for From The Brickyard in the horseshoe tournament where his soft touch and accuracy will help do damage on the A squad. Not afraid of picons or pressure on the lanes look for Southie to be an important piece in getting this team some big Saturday points.



Mike "Sleepy" Johnson (ROY 2002)

After a long offseason of naps, Sleepy returns this year with a whole different golf game in tow. He has been hitting the course no less than once a week and is rumored to be a hidden gem for From The Brickyard this year. If this is true, Casanova may finally get some help and notch some points in golf. Johnson was as impressive as his teammates in the pits and helped carry them all the way to the third place finish. Whomever he teams up with during SNC 16 will make a solid squad. One thing for sure, he would like to forget his year at the Carson Lanes where he bowled a well below average game of 112 to help his team to the early first round exit.

2011 Prediction: 6th Place

Although points for this team in golf may never happen, they have the tools to get it done in both horseshoes and bowling. With their team intact for the first time in the new era, look for them to score in both of those events and move up a couple places.



POINT SHAVERS

YEARS IN THE LEAGUE: 15

CHAMPIONSHIPS: 5 (1997, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002)

2010 Sierra Nevada Classic – 7th Place (Zero Points, escaped last place by 50 pins)

This squad, for the most part, was unwatchable throughout the weekend in SNC 15. Their day started off somewhat ok at Carson Valley as they still had a chance for points at the turn, but a bogie on 10 where one of Wetenkamp's brand new sleeve of Pro V balls mysteriously disappeared from the fairway sent them into a downward spiral toward a 7th place finish in golf, second only to From The Brickyard with most bogies of the round with five. The past two years, The Shavers have only used four of his tee shots, the required amount, and those four shots, can be described as unplayable. After a night of monster movies, "Vampire By Night" and "Zombie By Day", Keinath arrived in his room at 5:30am sleepless. During horseshoes he had about as much energy as a three toed sloth and could only help his B Squad with 3 points in their blowout loss against The Penetrators. After lunch he appeared to get his second wind and led his team with an nice score of 148 but it wasn't enough to stop the bleeding.



Kevin "Special K" Verre

Special K is back for his third year in the tourney and was the one positive for his team on the course. Verre hit the fairway all round as he led the team with seven of his drives. Only three of his putts were used during the round, but this was due to the fact that other teammates made putts ahead of his turn. Look for Verre again to have another solid performance in golf this year to try and help raise his team out of the cellar. Verre like the rest of his team had an ugly day at the pits and his one point in the first round was pretty hard to watch. Lunch for this kid can be a problem, but he held his own at the JT and made it to the alley without any major incidents. Yet, his evening at the lanes didn't pan out like he had planned, as his score of 97 added to his teams lowlight in bowling.

2011 Prediction: Last Place

Extra picons for this Irishman can be an interesting move as there is no telling what kind of Leprechaun will end up at the Carson Lanes. You could get the smiling one at the end of the rainbow or the Leprechaun from the 1993 horror film featuring Jennifer Aniston. A very risky move for any captain to make as Schellin would go on to bowl a frightful 77.

2011 Prediction: 7th Place


