Gentlemen,

The Sierra Nevada Athletic Commission welcomes you to the Twelfth Annual Sierra Nevada Classic. As the fresh smell of cut grass on cool autumn nights in the Capital City of Nevada returns, so do thirty grizzly Sierra Nevada Athletes. Once again city officials send out their yearly warnings to keep the women and children inside for the entire tournament weekend. Over three hundred media credentials have been issued to this event, for front row seats to the most anticipated event every year in Northern Nevada.

Since the First Annual Sierra Nevada Classic, forty-four athletes have participated in this invitation only event. In 2004, the Sierra Nevada Athletic Commission officially closed the doors on expansion of the league. The only future changes will be the unfortunate departures and subsequent additions to the individual teams that have already been created.

Established in May of 1996, the Sierra Nevada Classic has grown to an impressive event that former standout high school and college athletes now call home. Once a year, these athletes relive the days of glory in a one-day tournament that holds the same passion of years gone by. The weekend of friendship and memories continues to grow with as much force as was experienced in SNC 1.

A few official changes have been implemented by the Commission for the 12th Annual Tournament.

Changes are as follows:

1. One-year Veteran Bryan “Mo” Murdock was sent back down to the Missouri Minor Leagues to work on his picon consumption.
2. Mike “The Silent Assassin” Borda suffers an off-season Achilles tear and will don the zebra suit on tourney day.
3. John “Brute” Borda officially retires from referee and umpire duties at the tournament, and becomes the first member elected to the Sierra Nevada Classic Hall of Fame.
4. Ted “The Sheep Whisperer” Borda is signs a life-long contract for officiating.
5. Ryan “Gorko” Berkich signs a multi-year deal with the veteran team Let It Ride.
6. Rick “The Count” Oxoby is signed by veteran team the Point Shavers to a one year deal with incentives.
7. Three more Sierra Nevada Classic Athletes go down in marriage, Johnny “Joe Camel” Borda, Jim “Chilinch” Tierney and Mark “Ziggy” Manning.
8. Commission implements code of conduct for all athletes in attendance for SNC 12.

SIERRA NEVADA CLASSIC HALL OF FAME



John "Brute" Borda (1st Ballot HOF)

Last year marked the end of an era for the Sierra Nevada Classic as 11-year veteran referee and umpire, John Borda, officially hung up his strips. Known for his let 'em play style in the gym and his pitcher friendly strike zone, Brute will be remembered most for not taking any flak from SNC athletes. There was little doubt in the Commissions' mind that with his retirement the SNC Hall Of Fame would be born, where Borda was unanimously elected as the first ballot, original inductee. Brute will remain in the Classic in a supervisory role to help maintain order and to oversee proper picon consumption.

Ted "The Sheep Whisperer" Borda (Rookie Official)

After several failed attempts to lure the legend Brute out of his retirement, the SNC Commission had to move quickly to secure one of Northern Nevada's most esteemed officials. In his heyday at Douglas High, this giant in a small package lettered in football, wrestling and baseball. Although the Commission was hesitant to add another Borda to the tourney day mix, they knew they couldn't pass on the former athlete's tenacity and his decision making precision on the hardwood and the diamond. Growing up a stone's throw from the JT, the halftime stop will be business as usual.



Mike "The Silent Assassin" Borda (Rookie Official)

Mike Borda enters SNC 12 in some unfamiliar territory. For the first time he will be participating on the other side of the fence in a tournament he has been such a big part of as an athlete and member of the Point Shavers. Look for him to pick up the officiating side of tourney day without missing a beat. Commission Officials were somewhat leery of this long time member of The Shavers officiating in the tournament and they will keep a close eye on any favoritism thrown in the direction of the Point Shavers Camp.

Jon Faulkner returns for his second season behind the camera at the SNC. TRIPLE PLAY

2006 Sierra Nevada Classic - Champions (2nd Place Wiffleball, 1st Place Bowling)

2006 Summary

What an incredible tournament for Triple Play in 2006. Over a span of eleven years, they became only the fifth team in SNC History to bring home the title. The wind went out of their sails early after a tough loss in their opening round of hoops to the basketball powerhouse Stage Fright 6 – 7. But Triple play was just getting started. In the pre-tournament round in wiffleball, they got back at Stage Fright with an 8 – 3 win. Next, they got past From the Brickyard 6 – 5 before succumbing to the champion Fistful of \$\$\$ 4 – 1. After an enjoyable halftime stop, they moved on to the alley where they produced the most powerful display of force in the history of the SNC. With a total pin average of 465.75 in their four games of bowling, this squad that has knocked on the door so many times in the past finally secured their first SNC Title.

Mike “Paw” Berkich – Captain (MVP – 2006)

Captain Mike Berkich struts into the tourney this year with a Championship trophy in one hand and an MVP trophy in the other. Doing what captains are supposed to do, Berkich put his team on his shoulders when they needed him most, in the clutch. Berkich pitched like a seasoned vet along with getting some key base hits to help his team get to the championship round on the diamond. It was what this kid did on the lanes last year that is stuff of legend.

His four games went like this, 162, 149, 195 and then a 186 pin dagger in the hearts of the Colt .45s in the championship game to secure the title. With the confidence Berkich has coming into SNC 12, a second straight MVP doesn't seem that far fetched.



Rob “Bor” Stoddard

Rob Stoddard also cruises into this years tourney with a little bit of a pimp walk. Just like his captain, Bor's bowling game was awe inspiring. His four game average of 149.25 was third highest of the day. After this athlete has his drink on and the belly full at the JT, he has all of the fuel he needs to get the tusks in motion. Another key for his squad is his yearly improvements on the diamond. He is the piece that completes this now dominant team. Bor has been hitting the gym during the off season to improve his hoop skills in order to become one of the top tier classic athletes. However, with a baby boy on the way days before SNC 12,

this fierce athlete may be a bit deprived in the sleep department come tourney time.



Mike “Sleepy” Johnson (ROY-2002)

It's a bird, no it's a plane, no it's Mike “Sleepy” Johnson, awakening out of his off season hibernation for the first time of the year. Even after eleven months of sleeping, this kid comes out of the blocks faster than any Olympic Athlete during the upcoming games. Not much work was needed for this athlete during the winter. He mirrored both of his teammates at the lanes, with the fourth highest average on tourney day with 143.50. The speed that Johnson brings his team is immeasurable, and it gives them a chance at any time to get points or runs that other teams can't rely on. Don't be surprised if Sleepy has an MVP trophy for his pillow

for his off-season slumber after tourneys end.

2006 Prediction- 2nd Place

Although this team proved they have the stuff needed to take home the hardware, they did win two wiffleball games by one run each against some middle of the road teams. Yet, no one can deny their outright domination at the alley. If Triple Play can get the roughly the same seeding as last year, look for them to be the second team in SNC History to repeat.

COLT .45s

2006 Sierra Nevada Classic – 2nd Place (2nd Place Basketball, 2nd Place Bowling)

2006 Summary

Angered by their sixth place finish in 2005, the Colt .45s came out of the gate breathing fire. When the smoke had cleared after the grueling tournament day, this veteran squad was just 45 pins shy in the bowling alley from taking their second SNC Title. This was hands down the Colt .45s best performance in hoops since their inception in the league. A first round warm up against Full House was all they needed to jumpstart their day. In the semifinals they were matched up against the favorite Let It Ride, and easily took the game with a score of 7-3. In the championship match up against the heavily favored Brickyard, they went down to the wire in a knock-down drag-out battle, coming within one point of stealing the basketball crown. Maybe a little over confident with the draw of the Point Shavers in wiffleball, the Colt .45s lost a heartbreaker 3 – 6 and talked to their shoes until lunch. But the picons must have touched a nerve, because once the Colt .45s hit the lanes, they hit their stride. An impressive 447 in the pre-tourney gave them a 2 seed; next a 427 in the first round and a 372 in the semis to set up the winner take all matchup with Triple Play. Even though they rolled a 419, they couldn't beat destiny.

Jim "2-4-2" McHugh – Captain

Captain Jim McHugh, the straw that stirs the drink, makes it back for his eighth Classic with an impressive resume. His basketball skills at last years tourney were a sight to see. Who can forget his legendary shot in the semifinal match up against Let it Ride. The turn around jumper from 15 feet with his eyes closed to put the dagger on Joe Camel, may have been one of the Classic's most famous shots. He was again a man amongst boys in the alley with the second highest average of 153.25 in four games. When the shamrock ball is rollin' straight, and 2-4-2 has his drink on, the pins don't stand a chance.

The only negative for McHugh during last year was on the diamond. The bat may have been attached to his shoulder during their one and done game in wiffleball, and of course you can't expect a man of this age to be getting out of the box in order to catch any foul balls. During the off-season McHugh will be spending nearly a month back in his home town of New Jersey. Look for the pillow talk to be in full swing with more than one of his ex-flings.



Jim "Chilinch" Tierney (MVP – 2004)

Jim Tierney, the one-time league MVP, is also back for this eighth tournament and again gives his squad a chance to win it every year. Several solid games in hoops last year helped the .45s nearly take home first place in the gym. Tierney did however break stride during the wiffleball tournament while giving up six runs to the Point Shavers, several via the long ball. In the past, this might have been when his shoes would start to take over for the rest of the day. But this is the new Jim Tierney; he shook of the loss, cruised through half time at the JT, and finished the day in the alley with the best bowling tournament of his career. With a 160 in the championship, he did everything he could to get the Colt

.45s their second title. Hopefully, he can have a repeat performance despite the ringing of wedding bells in the near future.



Toby "The Serb" Basta

Toby Basta makes it back for his third tourney and can no longer be considered an underdog as his athletic ability gives the Colt .45s a favorable matchup in any event. The few holes he has in his hoop game he makes up for with his heart and hustle and his ability to rake any pitch out of the yard in wiffleball, coupled with his stealth coverage of the outfield, puts him as a front runner in the hunt for this year's MVP trophy. Although his bowling game started out strong in last year's tourney, he faded quickly in both the semifinal and championship games at the lanes. With an aggressive training regimen in the off-season, look for the Serb to be running on all cylinders for SNC 12. Just don't loan him your

9-iron on the golf course.

2007 Prediction – 3rd Place

The Colt .45s will now have the same team intact for the third straight year, which should make them one of the favorites in 2007. Don't rely on them leaving the wiffleball without any points this year and although another second place in hoops is a tall order, they are always one of the teams to beat at the Carson Lanes.

2006 Sierra Nevada Classic – 3rd Place (1st Place Basketball, 4th Place Wiffleball)

2006 Summary

From the Brickyard took the disappointment of 2005, where they finished in 8th Place, and used it as motivation right from the start in SNC 11. Once again they showed why they are the team to beat in hoops, going 4-0 in the gym. Although none of the games were blowouts, The Brickyard showed the veteran savvy of a team that has been together since SNC 4. Although his days of dunking are gone, the touch on his jumper is always a thing of beauty. He has proven the he has long ball power on the diamond and is said to be one off the top catchers in the league. Although he is very close to acquiring a taste for the picons at half time, he still shows the look of pain with each sip. When he moves to the lanes, he is all business. He did everything he could in the two games with scores of 131 and 151 to give his squad a chance to advance, but his team could not mirror the intensity during crunch time. Carlos "The Apostle" Mendeguia

Carlos Mendeguia is also back for his ninth season as the team's playmaker on the hardwood. Being the elder of the club he has fallen into the role of player/coach. As coach he always has a play or two to get some easy buckets on tourney day and as a player, this kid has the skills of a Steve Nash in the assist department and can bury open jumpers with the accuracy of a sniper. The JT stop, as with many basquos, is just like a nice leisurely walk in the park, a blip on the tourney day radar. Once at the bowling alley, he came out the locker room and bowled an impressive 131 score to help advance his team to the first round. Unfortunately, his score of 114 in that first round pretty much sealed The Brickyards fate and closed the door on any chances of their first title.



Paul "Packsand" Kinne (MI – 2006)

Like his teammates, Paul Kinne returns for his ninth classic. Packsand had another solid year at the gym setting picks for Silk and the Apostle and getting any loose balls that fell at his feet. His biggest contribution however was on the wiffleball field where he pitched every inning of three games for a total of 690 pitches. Although his team only won one game, the fourth place finish on the diamond was The Brickyards' best in tournament history giving them a great chance to get their names on the title plaque. How Packsand's arm was still attached to his shoulder is still a medical mystery. He sailed through half time and was feeling like a million bucks, until the pre-tournament score of 95 brought him

back to earth. But he didn't cave in and followed with an impressive score of 133 in the first round. Paul looks to come back stronger this year, but there is concern about Kinne's vision being a bit blurred due to an off-season water skiing crash that sent him skipping like a flat stone several times across the water before nearly peeling his face off.

2006 Sierra Nevada Classic – 4th Place (3rd Place Basketball, 3rd Place Wiffleball)

2006 Summary

Tourney day in 2006 got off to an unbelievable start for Let It Ride. Although the night before the Governor drew them an unfavorable seed in hoops against the mighty Fistful of \$\$\$, they showed no fear in a 7-3 upset. This got the Camels/Marlboros rolling as they made mince meat of the Undertakers with a 7 – 1 thrashing. Yet, even though they hit a road block in the form of the Colt .45s with a 3-7 loss in the semifinal round, they went on to take the Consolation game upsetting Stage Fright. The momentum continued to build on the diamond as they blew out the Undertakers with a score of 20-4 in the first round. Fistful of \$\$\$ paid them back in the semifinals handing them a 1-4 loss, but they squeaked out a 10-8 victory against From The Brickyard in the consolation game to secure third place and an overall total of four points heading into halftime. With solid games in both hoops and wiffleball, rookie Mo Murdock appeared to be the final piece of the Let It Ride championship puzzle. After an off-season of head-shaking, Let It Ride ownership had no option but to send Murdock down to the minors to work on his half time game and picon consumption and in turn purchased the contract of one of the best free agents available, Ryan “Gorko” Berkich.

Johnny “Joe Camel” Borda - Captain

After years of roster changes, Captain Johnny Borda wheezes into SNC 12 with maybe the team with the best chances to finally win a title. However, with an off season filled with wedding planes and wedding bells a mere two weeks after the tournament weekend, this veteran may have his mind elsewhere come tip off. With Murdock gone, and unless his rookie teammate can make an immediate impact, he will need to be the main scoring threat in hoops. Still spry after all these years, he will again roam the outfield like a gazelle. His diving catch last year was one of ESPN’s top ten web gems of 2006. He did everything he could to help his team out of the pre-tournament bracket in bowling with a solid 145, but added with the 165 pins of his teammates, the writing was on the wall. Look for Joe Camel to again be one of the front runners to take the MCS (Most Cigarettes Smoked) title on tourney weekend.



Mike “Goose” Wetenkamp

Along with his pitching dominance, he is also the heart and soul of Let It Ride’s batting order. For his team to have any chance for a title, he will need to improve greatly at the bowling alley and break the century mark. Also, look for him to give Joe Camel a run for his money for the MCS.



Ryan “Gorko” Berkich (Rookie)

Ryan Berkich comes into his first classic with the most media hype of any rookie in the history of the SNC. This kid was a man child in the Southern Nevada Vegas Leagues and looks to showcase his talents in this most hollowed league. Although off-season workouts were closed to the public, his rumored size and strength will be greatly needed in the paint in hoops to give them the match-up option they have so desperately needed. With both of his teammates superior wiffleball skills, any help at all on the diamond will be bonus. Hopefully his off-season workout includes numerous twelve-ounce curls in order to avoid a melt down after the half time picon blitz, which as everyone knows, has been the undoing of many a rookie.

Although the addition to Berkich seems a match made in heaven for Let It Ride, any finish higher than fourth place would be a stretch with a rookie on the team.

David "The Stormin' Ex-Mormon" Dodson

David Dodson struts into this years tourney to compete in his milestone tenth Sierra Nevada Classic. Look for him to leave opponents baffled again while at the plate at SNC 12. Post-JT, his score of 169 was a shot in the arm for a team that always struggles at the Carson Lanes. Odds are he will pencil himself in again on the mound during wiffleball due to the fact he may be the only one on the squad who can throw strikes and he should be able to replicate the impressive run at the Carson Lanes, with a three game average of 137. This athlete

knows that he needs to lead by example and that the Penetrator's fate is based on his performance.



Bill "Da Whala" Isaman (ROY – 1997)

Bill Isaman again lands his massive body on shore for his eleventh time in the tourney. While migrating during the off season the Whala brought yet another whale into the world. Look for the veteran to have loose blow hole and be a bit cranky due to lack of sleep during tournament weekend. After the picon stop at the JT, which is very impressive for a man of his stature, Wurster came out of the locker room with a chip on his shoulder. Even though his pre-tourney score of 121 was a bit off his average, he rebounded in the first round with a solid 145 game. However, the Shortstack began to tire as he finished the day with a meek 103 in the semifinal and 92 in the consolation match. For his team to have any shot at finishing in the top three, Schellin is going to have to dig in at the batter's box on the wiffleball diamond. Don't bet money on these guys to take another fourth place in hoops. Unless the meet up early with From The Brickyard, they will again be in the finals for second time in three years. But as is the pattern, after hoops is over, so is Stage Frights.

Borda, still leading the strike against the Classic to have basketball removed from the tourney, will again reluctantly head back to the gym. In 2006, Borda scored an all time tournament record with eight beers down before the tip off in hoops. With another four in the dug out in wiffleball, his record of twelve beers before half time may never be touched. Even though the Count is a seasoned veteran at the JT, he has never had to participate in live action after the stop there. Pay special attention to his performance at the Carson Lanes, as it may make or break this team's finish for SNC 12.

Even an improvement to ninth place would be a positive step for this team. They need to hope last year was an aberration and that they can show they belong in the competition.

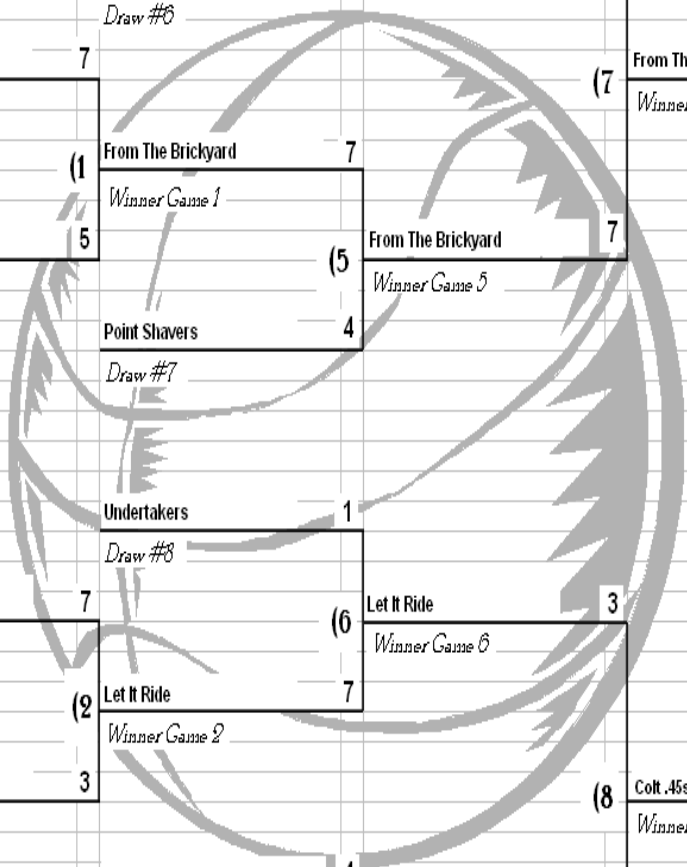
