Gentlemen,

Once again the time has come to pack your bags and head for the place of a thousand thrills. The Sierra Nevada Athletic Commission welcomes you to the 7th Annual Sierra Nevada Classic. Follow the old Kit Carson Trail, until the desert meets the hills and you will find yourself in Carson City, NV, the home of this highly anticipated annual tournament. Classic tournament officials have again hand-selected gualified candidates who can withstand the rigors that this weekend will place upon them.

In 1996, the Sierra Nevada Classic was born with 3 teams and 9 athletes. The SNC has again voted in favor of expansion to their prestigious league. SNC VII will be compressed of 10 teams and 30 athletes. It has been confirmed by the commissioners office, that this indeed will be the last year of expansion, and barring replacement of absent team members, no new members will be added.

The Commission has once again implemented a few changes for this year's tournament.

Changes are as follows:

- 1) Expansion teams, "Full House" and "The Undertakers" join the league.
- 2) New members, John Wurster, Mario Schroder, Deon Lewis and Pete Kinne are drafted.
- 3) Returning Members, Kris "Skeets" Kelly and Rich "All World" Hutson are back from a one-year absence.
- 4) Minimum 5 Picon Punch limit prior to lunch.
- 5) Four teams, will be drawn to a pre-tourney bracket in both basketball and wiffle ball to enter the standard bracket.

In Case of a tie after all events are finished on Saturday, the following will take place. After individual event scores have been totaled, teams will then be ranked based on how many events in which they placed (Including 4th Place). If there is still a tie, then the tams will be ranked on how many total individual games in which they competed. If there is still a tie, then total bowling average by team will be used. However, if the tie is for first place in the overall tournament, a bowl off will be implemented.


SIERRA NEVADA CLASSIC OFFICIALS

John "Brute" Borda – 6-Year Veteran Official

The Point Shavers got off to an unfamiliar start in last years tourney with a first round loss in hoops and appeared to be doomed. However, these stubborn vets grinded out a 3rd place in Wiffle Ball and slammed the door shut with a 1st Place in Bowling.

<u>The Team</u>

After an opening round loss in hoops, Let it Ride came back strong in Wiffle Ball and nearly took 1st place. With Wetenkamp bowling in work boots in the afternoon, a 4th place was as high as they could muster in the alleys.

<u>The Team</u>

Captain Johnny Borda is back for his 0th year in the Classic and brings with him added weight. He has bulked up big during the offseason by hitting the weight room and adhering to a strictly carbohydrate diet (Beer and Bread). <u>The Team</u>

2001 Sierra Nevada Classic – 7th Place (3rd Bowling)

<u>2001 Summary</u>

The year 2001 will not be a good year for the Penetrators to remember. There wasn't a band-aid big enough for them to stop the bleeding. The teams opening loss in hoops, coupled with some inside bickering, left this once dominant team with some major problems to contend with.

<u>The Team</u>

Classic Veteran and Captain Kip Perry had his hands full during the off-season. Not only was he supervising counseling sessions for his team, he also was maintaining a "full time job" for the first time in, ever. He has assured tournament members that all of his teams' problems have been ironed out and they will be back bigger and stronger that ever. 






SIERRA NEVADA CLASSIC VI Wiffle Ball Tournament
