Scramble Rules

Method of play and rules:

1. Play begins with each member of the group teeing off.
2. With the agreement of the other members of the group, the team captain decides which drive is the most desirable.
3. The other members of the group pick up their balls and proceed to the spot of the selected drive, where they will hit their second (or third, or fourth, etc. shot).
4. After the shot, all balls may be placed within one club length of the original ball. This may be done either to the side or backwards. Balls may not be placed closer to the hole.
5. In placing the ball, you may not change the condition of the shot. If the ball is in a hazard (e.g. sand trap, rough) all members of the team must play their shot from the trap or rough, respectively.
6. This procedure continues until the ball is in the hole.
7. On the putting green, **do not hole out a short putt if you have missed your first putt.** The first ball putted must count. Mark your ball and wait. If the second or third putt is better, mark that putt. Under no circumstances will there be any gimmies.
8. At the end of each hole, the score for the group is recorded on the card.
9. All scorecards must be kept accurately and per hole.
10. Each player on the team must contribute at least **two** tee shots per 18 holes. If only three members are on a team, **three** tee shots must be used per 18 holes. When recording your score on the card, you must input which player's tee shot was used on every hole. Also mark down which member of your team made the putt.
11. The maximum score allowed is a double-par. After that, simply pick up the balls and move on to the next hole.



SNC Horseshoe Tournament Rules

Method of play and rules:

1. All court layout dimensions, playing equipment and scoring will follow the official rules sanctioned by the NHPA (National Horseshoe Pitchers Association of America).
2. Cancellation scoring will be used to keep score during the tournament.
3. Ringer: Ringers cancel each other. A ringer of one contestant shall cancel a ringer of another contestant and those shoes shall not score any points. Any uncanceled (live) ringers shall score 3 points.
4. Shoes in Count: A shoe in count (upright horseshoe length from the stake) shall score one point under the following conditions: If there are cancelled ringers and no live ringer, the closest shoe in count to the stake shall score one point. If there are no ringers, the closest shoe in count to the stake shall score one point. If the other shoe of the same contestant is the second closest shoe in count, it shall also score one point. If there is one uncanceled ringer and the other shoe of the scoring contestant is the closest shoe in count to the stake, it shall score one point (four points total).
5. On tournament day, there will be one scorekeeper per game. This score sheet shall be the official record of the game. Contestants are encouraged to pay close attention to the score at all times. If a question or discrepancy occurs regarding the score, the contestant(s) may approach the scorekeeper between innings to rectify the situation. This scorekeeper or other identified authority will also judge any discrepancy of which contestants shoes are closer to the stakes during the game. If discrepancies cannot be corrected to the satisfaction of all contestants, the tournament judge shall be called in to make the final decision.
6. Each team will be comprised of four pitchers. Each team will be selected into an eight team bracket that will be drawn on seeding night.
7. The Horseshoe Tournament will begin with your team dividing into two teams of two contestants. **(These teams must be determined before seeding)**. Your two teams will be matched against the other team in your bracket who will also divide their team into two teams of two contestants.
8. Please note that your "A" squad will match up with your opponents "A" squad along with "B" squad vs. "B" squad in your individual bracket. If both of your split squads win, you advance out of bracket. If one squad loses and the other wins, only the winning squad can participate in the tie breaker to advance to the next round. Also, the bottom team in the bracket will call the coin toss and be able to choose individual match ups within the bracket. There will again be a coin flip in case of a tie breaker.
9. Each game will be played to twenty-one points (First team to twenty-one, no need to win by two points). However, the skunk rule will be in effect. If any team scores eleven points before their opponent scores one point, the game is over. Final score would be (11-0).
10. The Sierra Nevada Athletic Commission will allow alcohol, smoking and chewing during this tournament event.



SNC Bowling Tournament Rules

Method of play and rules:

1. Teams will begin round one play based on Thursday night bracket seeding.
2. The teams that win in the first round will advance to the second round and either the title or consolation games via match play.

Overall Tournament Scoring Rules

1 st Place In An Individual Event.....	4 Points
2 nd Place In An Individual Event.....	3 Points
3 rd Place In An Individual Event.....	2 Points
4 th Place In An Individual Event.....	1 Point

Tiebreaker

If the day ends with a tie for first place in the overall tournament, a bowl-off will be implemented to determine the champion. Then, in order to determine the overall finish other than first, total points and then total bowling average will be used to rank teams.

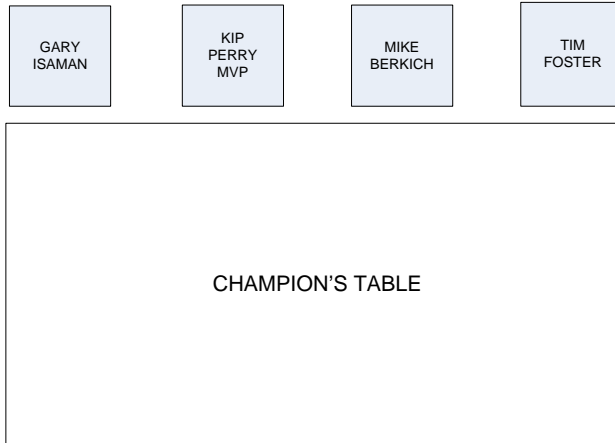

PENETRATORS

YEARS IN LEAGUE: 17

CHAMPIONSHIPS: 5 (2012, 2011, 2008, 1998, 1996)

2012 Sierra Nevada Classic - Champions (3rd Place Horseshoes, 1st Place Bowling)

One of the original teams in the SNC, this storied franchise tied a SNC record with their 5th Championship in SNC 17—this time with a rookie so mysterious, the only information the Commission could dig up on him was that he was terrible at raising pigs. No matter, they went on to win their second tourney in a row and in 2013, they will compete to be only the second team in SNC history to three-peat. It wasn't easy for The Penetrators as they got off to a slow start in golf and finished a stroke behind the Point Shavers to finish 5th overall and had to head to the horseshoe pits with zero points. It looked pretty bleak for the Champs as they drew the mighty Colt .45s in the first round, arguably the toughest horseshoers in the tourney since the sport was added. They dug down deep and behind Captain Kip Perry's chant of "Nobody puts baby in a corner," from his all-time favorite movie, Dirty Dancing, the Penetrators did the lambada all over the .45s and swept them off their feet and out of the first round. They lost their next match to FTB but came back in the consolation to take 3rd place overall. It was anyone's ball-game going into bowling so The Penetrators decided to do what they do best—win bowling and wait to see what happens. They did just that by cruising through their three games to set up a bowl-off with Stage Fright for the Championship trophy. It looked close early on, but The Penetrators shut the door on Stage Fright and celebrated their second Championship in as many years. As the popular Dirty Dancing song, "I Had The Time Of My Life" played in their hotel rooms throughout the rest of the night, it was rumored that the victors were seen in the pool practicing their joy-induced, Patrick Swazye-esque, airplane shoulder lifts of each other until dawn.



Kip "Greez" Perry – Captain (MVP – 2012, 2008, 1998)

Another year, another MVP award for this captain who is now only one award shy of the once-untouchable 4 MVPs gathered over 17 years by founder Mike Borda. Greez slimed his way through this year's tourney as he usually does, leading by example. His team-high 7 drives, 5 putts and a beautiful chip-in got his team close to points in golf, but they came up one stroke short. He then rallied the troops and with their backs against the wall in the first round of horseshoes, Kip chose "fight" not "flight" as he slid the horseshoes all over the pin, racking up 9 ringers and 29 points on his way to 3rd place. He wasn't done yet. The oily lanes welcomed their ilk as Greez dropped a 148, 155, and 164 to help his team to 1st place in bowling. With the bowl-off set to crown a new champ, Kip smeared a 180 all over Stage Fright to take home the trophy.



Mike "Paw" Berkich (MVP – 2006)

Where this veteran goes, success follows. He now has three championships under his belt with no signs of slowing down any time soon. Paw got off to a good start in SNC 17 on the golf course where you would think that he would be a bit timid considering his old hand injury sustained when an errand golf ball almost ended his career, but not Paw. He stroked 4 drives and 5 putts all while dealing with the paranoia of hand-seeking missiles. He then moved his way over to Aspen Park where he dropped 3 ringers and 11 points on the pits and then he really went to work. Relaxed and focused knowing that it was highly unlikely that the paw could take a hit from a flying bowling ball; Berkich was a mad man on the lanes where he threw 164, 185 and 190 to carry his team to 1st place in bowling. He then bowled a 147 in the bowl-off which was all his team needed from him to secure the trophy.



Tim "The Flame" Foster (MVP – 2011)

The Flame came out on Saturday morning and split the fairway 4 times while finding the bottom of the cup 4 times as well. Decent, but nothing compared to his next feat. With all of the chips on the table for his team in horseshoes, Tim faced the dreaded Hudson brothers in round one and the odds were not in his favor. Instead of the Hudsons extinguishing the hopes of The Penetrators, The Flame scorched them with 2 ringers and 6 points en route to a sweep. His totals for the day (7 ringers and 13 points) were enough to secure two points in horseshoes which would prove later to be very important. With previous lunch-indulgences in the rear view mirror, The Flame did what he does best—he charred the lanes with a 252 in his first round to get his team off on the right foot. He then stayed consistent with a 182 and a 184 before toasting Stage Fright with a 200 in the bowl-off to solidify the Championship for his team, all the while leaving a trail of burn victims scattered all over the Carson Valley that looked like something out of Rambo 3.



Gary "Bacon" Isaman

It would be the understatement of the year to say that this rookie exceeded his teams' expectations in SNC 17. Ownership had no idea what to expect from Bacon, but they certainly didn't expect much from his golf game. Instead, Isaman showed that even bad pig growers can golf and his team used three of his drives as well as three of his putts on the way to a 5th place finish. Then he hoofed it over to the pits where, unlike the consumers of Gary's pigs, The Penetrators really got what they paid for. Bacon spearheaded a sweep of the favorite Colt .45s dropping 3 ringers and 3 points in the opening round and throwing a tourney second best 12 ringers with 10 points to help his team grab 3rd place in horseshoes. It was time to see if the powerful "rookie curse of the picon" would be in place this year, and after he butchered a god-awful 57 in his first bowling match, it looked like his meat was going to be a little thin this year. However, in the turn-around of the century, he shook the effects of the picon and bowled a 113 and then a 137 in his next two matches and ended with a 106 to help his team grab the trophy in his rookie year.

2013 Prediction: 2nd Place

These guys are tough and could easily win their third in a row, but if they get blanked again in golf and if they fail to secure at least some points in horseshoes, they will end the day with only their bowling to rely on and four points will not cut it. This will be the year that Stage Fright penetrates The Penetrators.



STAGE FRIGHT

YEARS IN LEAGUE: 16

CHAMPIONSHIPS: 0

2012 Sierra Nevada Classic – 2nd Place (2nd Place Golf, 2nd Place Horseshoes)

Sixteen years. That's a long time. That's how long this franchise has gone without winning a championship. Is Stage Fright destined to become the Chicago Cubs of the SNC? Will they result to slaughtering animals or rubbing chicken bones together in an effort to lift this oppressive curse? Will murmurings of "F@#\$ you, Jo-boo, we will do it ourselves," be heard on the tee box this year? There are many questions that this team needs to answer, but consider this—Stage Fright has steadily improved every year and if not for the heartbreaking loss in the bowl-off last year for all the marbles, these guys would have already nabbed that elusive first championship. In SNC 14 they finished seventh, in SNC 15 they climbed to fourth, in SNC 16 they improved to third and last year, they finished second. Could this be the year? In SNC 17, Stage Fright got off to a great start by once again taking a playoff hole from their golf rivals, Let It Ride, and snatching a 2nd place and three points. Next up was an event that has given them problems every year and they have never made it out of the first round in horseshoes. This year was different as they swept the Point Shavers in the first round, swept Fistful of \$\$\$\$ in the second round, and lost in the Finals to FTB to grab another three points. This meant that Stage Fright was heading to lunch in first place with a 2-point lead over Full House and FTB. With a first round win all but securing the title for Stage Fright, their picon-filled bellies settled in to take on the Point Shavers. The crafty veterans proved too much for them as the Point Shavers, led by an impressive 173 by Mike Borda, took control and left Stage Fright watching and computing outcomes the rest of day. They got what they wanted in another chance to win via the bowl off, but The Penetrators were too much and sent them to a 2nd place finish.



Lance "Yeti" Hammons – Captain (MI – 2004)

The Yeti again quietly led his squad to a good finish in 2012 with an array of grunts and glares. He used his minimum 2 drives in golf, but showed up big with 5 putts to spearhead a round of 5 birdies and no bogeys. At the end of regulation in golf his squad had to hit the links again in a playoff, so he calmly put his half-eaten cotton-tail rabbit into the sagebrush for later and led his team to a 2nd place finish. He then was found picking bugs out of his back hair as he went on to score 6, 5 and 7 of his teams points in another 2nd place finish in horseshoes. After spearing a trout out of the Carson River for lunch with his talon-like claws, he put a respectable 132 on the board in bowling in a losing effort before coming back with a 143 in the bowl off. He was last seen headed straight for Jobs Peak where he seemed to be communicating with the hawks through a series of snaps and clicks of his wide but nimble yeti-tongue.



Bill "Da Whala" Isaman (ROY – 1997)

Da Whala migrated into town for SNC 17 with a slimmer, almost starved looking physique that only fueled more rumors that global warming is negatively affecting our oceans. The absence of blubber proved beneficial to Da Whala as he spouted off 6 long drives and 4 putts en route to a 2nd place playoff win in golf. He then breached over to the horseshoe pits where he put together his best performance to date with 7 ringers and 23 points in three games, helping his team grab another 2nd place. But he must have overdid it on the krill at lunch as he barely showed up with a 105 in bowling as the sounds of a wounded whale could be heard via sonar all the way south to the US Naval station in San Luis Obispo.



Kyle "Leroy" Schellin (MI – 2003, ROY – 2001)

This new father of one has had a tough off-season of sleepless nights, dirty diapers and maximizing life-insurance interests to the tune of \$1.55 per year to a certain SNC member, but he will be ready to compete again in 2013. He oozed his talent all over the golf course as his team leaned on him for 6 drives and 7 putts in golf and he squeezed out 3 ringers and 33 points in his very impressive horseshoe outings. He stayed impressive and consistent in bowling as he posted 134 in the opening round and the same in the bowl-off. When contacted by the commission about his strong performance in 2012, Leroy spoke in the third person saying, "Leroy had a lot of output last year."



Craig "Lurch" Williams (ROY – 2008)

Coming off of a very strong golf performance in 2011, Lurch was again a wild card as he split the fairway four times and found the cup twice. His easy going attitude helped his erratic team stay grounded and focused as he contributed 2 ringers and 16 points in the 2nd place finish for horseshoes. However, Lurch and Da Whala must have been coached by the same bowling expert, 1987 CJHS PE Instructor Rick Redican, as he took a dump in the place that he sleeps with a 105 in the opening round in bowling. He rebounded in a big way with a 164 in the bowl-off, but it was too late and Lurch stiff legged it back to Reno to collect more residual checks from Adam's Family reruns.

2013 Prediction: 1st Place

This is the year. These guys know what it takes to win this tourney and they will pull it all together for the SNC and take home the hardware. They will be there in golf and they have found their groove in horseshoes. They could possibly be the first team in SNC history to have first place wrapped up by lunch. Look out—it's taken 16 years, but these guys are no longer afraid of the stage.



LET IT RIDE

YEAR IN LEAGUE: 15

2012 Sierra Nevada Classic – 3rd Place (3rd Place Golf, 2nd Place Bowling)

Another year, another near miss for Let It Ride. These guys have been one golf shot, one horseshoe or one pin away from becoming champions many times and 2012 was no different. And boy did they respond. They went on to score a tourney high 7 birdies and needed only one more to tie eventual champs Full House on the lengthy par five, 18th hole, but their sticks were all out of magic and they fell into a tie for second and lost the playoff for a 3rd place finish. With the Serb in tow, LIR headed out to the pits on Saturday morning ready to grab some more points, but they met up with the Fistful of \$\$\$\$ buzz-saw as Dot and Ziggy ran through both pairings—first beating Serb/Chilinch and then crushing Gorko/JB in the tiebreaker game 21-12. This left LIR going to lunch with only 2 points and not being known for their bowling prowess, it looked pretty bleak for these kids. But wait. What was this? You could hear the whispers in the hall—"Let It Ride beat FTB by one pin" and "Oh my. LIR is out of the first round." Up next was Fistful and down they went by 15 pins. The whispers in the hall were turning into back slaps—"Hey. If you guys can pull one more upset, you could win it all" and "Let It Ride is in the finals? Who are these guys?" But, alas, it was not meant to be for the heartbreak kids as The Penetrators showed them why they are the Kings of the Pins and slapped a 170 pin victory on them leaving LIR with 3rd place overall and with another 364 days wondering "what if?"



Johnny "The JB" Borda - Captain

Captain Borda came into 2012 hopeful that LIR would finally break through, but it was not to be. He hit the links like he always does—with a drink in each hand to numb the reality that he just isn't good at all. He again lived up to those low expectations by only using 3 drives and 2 putts. He moved over to the pits and threw 1 ringer and 13 points in a losing effort to Fistful and then headed to his best event by a long shot—lunch. It looked like he may have over-gulped his extra picons this year however, as he staggered into the lanes to bowl a gag-worthy 98 in round one. After re-hydrating with some Coors Lights, The JB just kept getting stronger with scores of 124 and 156 in the next two games before bowing out of the tourney with yet another trophy-less year.



Jim "Chilinch" Tierney (MVP – 2004)

With his flock of sheep happily grazing on the lush, green grasses of the Sierra Nevada Mountains, Chilinch flung his boda bag over his shoulder and strolled onto the golf course fit and focused for this year's tourney. He again put on a clinic and stroked 12 drives and 9 putts—both tournament highs. Perhaps a bit weary from the 42-mile "shepherd" walk from his band of sheep in the foothills of Pickle Meadows combined with a sore back from carrying LIR through the golf round, Jim was unable to get out of the first round of horseshoes, even though he threw a very nice round of 3 ringers and 3 points for 12 total points. Chilinch then had his usual lunch of a mutton sandwich and wild mountain berries unwrapped from the handkerchief tied around the stick over his shoulder and then walked over to the lanes where he dropped a 137 and 161 to help his team get to the finals. Just another day of hard work for this shepherder as he headed back up the mountain to sleep on his bed made of sagebrush and pine needles as he dreamt of the 2013 trophy.



Toby "The Serb" Basta

The Serb, busy with a keynote speech to the Salt Lake City Chapter of Serbian Knights, was unable to make the golf tourney. His vast knowledge of local Native American cultures and practices was greatly missed on the golf course, but he showed up Friday night with his trademark grin and wondrous slanders of all things holy. Maybe suffering a bit from his long, late night journey, he could only muster 7 points in his early exit from horseshoes, but The Serb kept everyone positive through lunch and was a huge part of the bowling success with three nice rounds of 106, 115 and 120. The Serb will be back for all three events in 2013 and he looks to return to form en route to a 2013 Championship.



Ryan "Gorko" Berkich (ROY – 2007)

Gorko was again a force on the links in 2012 and stepped up huge with long drives and second shots and surprising soft hands around the greens using 7 of his putts throughout the round. He then showed off his pit skills throwing 2 ringers and 7 points in the opening round before succumbing to Fistful in the tie breaker with 4 points. Lunch is never a problem for Gorko where he showed up with his Paul Bunyan appetite crushing his steak before sneaking countless lamb chops off the plates of unsuspecting diners and washing it all down with picons by the bucket and a vat of red wine. He then wiped his face with a bowl of stew and headed over to the lanes. Not known for his pin-mastery, LIR needed a big game from Gorko to get out of the first round and he obliged. It took every pin of his 164 to get past FTB by a single pin and then he posted scores of 137 and 135 showing the tourney members that he is a force to be reckoned with going forward. 2013: Prediction: 5th Place

Although LIR has placed in 5 out of 6 events in the last two years, they have had some favorable bracket match-ups and if they don't get those, they could very easily end up with very few points and short days in horseshoes and bowling. They have proved to be tough in golf year after year, but to win the coveted trophy in 2013; they will need to do more than just golf. Will this be the year that LIR finally gets a win or will heartbreak strike again? Only time will tell.

Championships: 3 (2010, 2009, 2007)

2012 Sierra Nevada Classic – 4th Place (1st Place Golf)

For SNC 14 and SNC 15 Full House seemed invincible, but in SNC 16 the chinks in their armor began to show as everyone could see how much their success in the tournament depended on their success on the golf course. Looking to bounce back from an awful SNC 16, Full House laced up the spikes and stomped into familiar territory as they would shoot 6 birdies, 1 eagle and only 2 bogeys to capture their third Golf Title in four years. In horseshoes they were matched up with a tough From The Brickyard team and would battle their way to the tiebreaker before running out of steam. Approaching the box on the first tee in his team's fuchsia and lime green golf shorts, Captain Skeets crushed a beautiful drive and continued to impress as he would contribute 5 drives and 5 putts on the way to the golf title. Moving to the next morning, after three years and three straight first round losses in horseshoes, Skeets and teammate The Apostle grinded out a one point win over From The Brickyard's B Squad but couldn't get past their A Squad as it would be another first round disappointment. It might have been a little difficult to focus on lunch since a first round matchup with the Penetrators loomed in bowling, but Skeets rolled with purpose on the lanes to end with an above average 148 in the defeat.



Rob "Bor" Stoddard

Still foaming at the mouth from a failed bid at a three-peat, Bor was ready for a reckoning in SNC 17. He blistered the Genoa Lakes for a team leading 7 drives along with a modest 3 putts to help capture the title. Next, it was time for the horseshoes to exact revenge and he did what he could with 3 ringers and 3 points in a narrow defeat, 18 – 21, to the eventual champions From The Brickyard. With a crushing of his lunch and picnics, it was time for Bor to flatten some pins. Even though he was a few pins south of his average he turned in a sharp 134 before heading to the bar with the rest of his teammates.



Paul "Packsand" Kinne (MVP – 2009, MI – 2006)

With a less than impressive SNC 16 performance, Packsand was ready to bring the pain with some purposeful packings to SNC 17. It began successfully on the links as Full House used 4 of his drives and 4 of his putts to capture yet another golf crown. Now it was time to get his hands in some familiar sand in the pits, but Packsand couldn't get it going and could only muster 1 ringer and 3 points as his A Squad would end the day without a win. Packsand would put it together at lunch with some Basque home cooking and drinking and he settled into the lanes with his below average bowling game where he stuffed a nice 118, ten pins better than his average, into another Full House loss.

2012 Sierra Nevada Classic – 5th Place (1st Place Horseshoes)

But he did what he could and contributed 3 drives to the team's last place effort. Southie's confidence was running high as he glided out of the JT and eased into Silver Strike Lanes where he held up his end of the bargain bowling a respectable 127. But he could only watch helplessly as FTB lost by a single pin and he lingered a little longer amongst the spectators, cuddling his bowling ball and holding back the tears.



Mike "Sleepy" Johnson (ROY – 2002)

Sleepy was looking to wake up his golf game for SNC 17, but instead slept walked through another round to add only 3 drives to a losing campaign. Horseshoes however would be a waking dream as he got out of bed with 15 total points (2 ringers, 9 points) and would chip in the rest of the day to finish with 4 ringers, 12 points and a Horseshoe Championship. 2013 Prediction: 4th Place

From The Brickyard has been climbing steadily since SNC 14 with overall, 6th, 6th, 5th and 5th place finishes, so it seems logical they will crack the top 4 this year. Golf will be another uphill battle, but another strong finish in horseshoes is predicted, and maybe, just maybe they will get the chance to redeem themselves on the lanes.



POINT SHAVERS

YEARS IN THE LEAGUE: 17

CHAMPIONSHIPS: 5 (2002, 2001, 2000, 1999, 1997)

2012 Sierra Nevada Classic – 6th Place (4th Place Golf, 3rd Place Bowling)

The Point Shavers finished the SNC in 6th place for SNC 17 and showed what might be a scary new side of their game as they shot 2 eagles and grabbed a point in golf by taking 4th place. Captained by Mike “The Silent Assassin” Borda, they arrived at the pits optimistic for the horseshoe matchup, but Stage Fright finally got the better of them in this heated rivalry and sent them to lunch with only one point. The picons are never a problem for this group and The Point Shavers came to play at the lanes winning their first game and the consolation round for a 3rd place finish and three points overall for the day. This left the Point Shavers headed back to the CVI with a 6th place finish and hope for next year.



Mike “The Silent Assassin” Borda (MVP – 2002, 2000, 1999, 1996)

On what would prove to be his last tournament before passing away in the off season after a year-long battle with pancreatic cancer, Captain and Founder Mike Borda hit the links on a full head of chemo and stroked 5 drives and sank 5 putts en route to an unexpected 4th place finish and a point in their pocket. In the opening round of horseshoes versus Stage Fright, he threw 2 ringers and 5 points, but it wasn’t enough as the Point Shavers were swept out of the first round. After lunch, Captain Borda dropped a 173 on Stage Fright as he led his team to a first round victory and then to an overall 3rd place finish in bowling.



Mike “Goose” Wetenkamp (MI – 2008)

After spending SNC 16 on the injured reserve as his shattered shoulder was on the mend, it was time to get out of Kinne’s kitchen and back onto the field for SNC 17. As he hit the links under a fog of months of pain killers and Coors Lights that would rival a hot tub party with Brett Favre, Mark Churmurra and a couple of prom dates, he showed signs of major progress. The Goose honked 3 putts to the bottom of the cup but more importantly, he showed signs of getting some strength back in his shoulder as he flew 4 drives down the fairways. Rodney “Spiderman” Keinath – Captain (MVP – 2001, 1997)

If there were an award for most improved in golf, it wouldn’t even be close. This guy has been getting better every year and has been rumored to be training with John Daly this off-season and his wife has reported that when he is sleeping at night, you can hear him muttering “Be the ball, Danny” between snores. He used his minimum 2 drives in SNC 17, but he got his “Noonan” on and sank 5 putts. Horseshoes were not kind to the Point Shavers this year as Spidey only had time for 1 ringer and 3 points before he was reverse-web slung into the spectator division. Rodney was promoted to Captain in the off-season and this original member of the SNC will look to steer the ship to calmer waters in SNC 18.



Kevin “Special K” Verre

Special K came out rapping to start the tourney and like his name-sake, he spit beats and rhymes as he made his way through the golf round with 5 drives and 5 putts that made Sugar Hill Records want to re-release his 1987 twelve inch titled “Special K Is Good.” He then went over to the pits where he gave a forgettable performance with 0 ringers and 2 points nearly inciting a riot of unhappy concert-goers demanding their money back. Lunch has been tricky for Special K at times, but not this year as went through the picons without missing a beat and then headed outside to the trunk of his Buick for a 40 of Old E. He then floated over to the lanes and dropped a 158 and the mic on Stage Fright, showing the record buyers that he still has what it takes.

2013 Prediction: 6th Place

With Spiderman as the new Captain and with Goose’s shoulder still mending, the Point Shavers have a lot of unanswered questions. If they are going to get points in golf again, they will need solid rounds from Special K and Goose and they need to do something in horseshoes if they are going to make a run at the title. They will compete with heavy hearts this year, but one thing is for sure—they will compete and will put together an inspired performance. Out of respect to their fallen teammate, Captain Keinath has petitioned the Commission to compete this year in the “Missing Man Formation” and his petition was granted pending review on a year-to-year basis. The Missing Man formation is a military salute that honors fallen soldiers and it was started in 1938 as a way to show the passing of a soldier to the heavens. In one variation of the missing man formation, all four military planes fly in a “V” formation travelling from the south at sunset. YEARS IN LEAGUE: 17

CHAMPIONSHIPS: 2 (2005, 2003)

2012 Sierra Nevada Classic – 7th Place (4th Horseshoes, 4th Place Bowling)

With nowhere to go but up after two consecutive last place finishes, Fistful strolled into SNC 17 with a nothing to lose confidence. That confidence was shattered quickly however as they sprayed balls everywhere but the fairways as they finished with 4 bogeys and only 2 birdies to end with a disastrous seventh place on the links. When Saturday dawned and with his faith shaken, the horseshoes couldn't find the stake as he threw only 2 ringers and 6 points in three matches. But at the JT, the X-Mormon found divinity amongst the picons as he floated into the alley and with the pressure on, bowled a career high 167 to anoint Fistful with a round 2 berth. He came back down to earth in the next couple of rounds, but the blessing had already been bestowed.



Mark "Ziggy" Manning

When Ziggy gently strode through the light morning dew and placed his ball on the tee of the first hole, he felt the warm sun on his back and a slight, cool breeze against his face. When slowly crouching up and down and taking some practice swings the birds sang sweetly around him. Swwwaaaaack! Plop! And so his day began and his lack of power and accuracy continued from the tee boxes as the minimum 2 drives were used. He did pick up the team sinking 5 putts, but, sigh, it was not enough. Saturday, a new day, and new hope for Ziggy as he became one with his horseshoes and teaming with his Captain Dot, moved on to Fistful's first Round 2 and ended a fruitful day with 3 ringers and 30 points! Feelings glowed at lunch as Ziggy brought the positive aura and transferred it to his bowling ball where he hugged the pins en route to a fantastic 160 and followed with a career best 166 before running out of steam with a 104.



Scott "The Leprechaun" Schellin (MI – 2002)

The Leprechaun was primed to slide down the rainbow as he pulled out his driver for SNC 17 and although only 3 of his drives were used, it was his putter that was golden as he led the team with 6 putts. However, on his native Nevadan sands for horseshoes he couldn't conjure any Irish luck as he could only muster 7 points with 0 ringers in three matches. Finding a few four-leaf clovers at the JT, Leprechaun jiggled his way to Silver Strike and battled his way to a 98, and with the rest of his teammates exhaled a huge sigh of relief. Leprechaun would then end his day with an improved 109 and an impressive 140.

2013 Prediction: 7th Place

Most critics say planets will need to align for Fistful to capture another crown. But if they can get some favorable seedings, recapture their golf game and continue to improve in horseshoes and bowling, you never know. Ace Frehley of KISS may have summed up SNC 18 best, "Here I am, again in this city, with a Fistful of Dollars and baby, you'd better believe, I'm Back!"

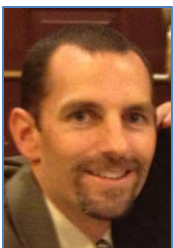
Jim “2-4-2” McHugh – Captain

But one of the best bowlers in the Classic couldn't find his groove or any PV Rolls as he ended his day with a 133, 15 points below his average, and visions of fatigues danced in his head.



Rich “All World” Huston (MVP – 2007)

All World is still trying to forget what happened in last year's Classic. The nightmare began at Genoa Lakes as only 3 of his drives and 4 of his putts were used. Moving to the horseshoe pits, where Colt .45s have dominated with 8 wins and 1 loss, All World pitched admirably with 3 ringers and 2 points, but it was not enough as his A Squad suffered their first ever Round 1 loss. After an MVP type lunch effort, All World laced up his bowling shoes and rolled his customary 124, but it was all for not and a small tear welled up in his eye as he knew he would not be blowing plastic horns in the gutters of Carson Street on Nevada Day.



John “Shortstack” Wurster

With a self-announced “faster” pace of play on the golf course, Shortstack led his team with 6 drives and also contributed a tidy 5 putts but he couldn't keep them above the Mendoza Line. Horseshoes also turned out to be another tall order as he could only toss for 2 points in an embarrassing loss to the Penetrators. Never one to keep his head down, Shortstack brought his lunch and picons down to size and led his team with a 136 in the lanes.
